THE PEOPLE'S THEATRE.—This theatre is providing splendid programmes these days for its patrons. "When War Threatened," a gripping secret service drama in two acts was followed with a great deal of interest by all. "Tough Luck on a Rough Sea," was well-described as a shipload of laughter. PRINCE EDWARD THEATRE.—The change of programme at the Prince Edward Theatre yesterday attracted large audiences. The ninth episode of that great serial "Peg of the Ring" was no less absorbing in interest than the chapters which had gone before. The story, in fact, seems to become more involved in thrills and waders as it goes along. A splendid pictorial presentation of sea coast drama was "The Smugglers of Saint Cruz." As well as being an exciting story it was of particular interest from the point of view of beautiful scenic production. Charlie Chaplin in "The Vagabond" with his odd style of fun keeps everyone in good humor. Two thousand feet of continuous laughter it was and no mistake. Another picture, "The Brink," a modern society drama rounded out a programme of tip-top excellence. This programme will be repeated at today's performances.

COLUMBUS SHIP RETURNS.—The "Santa Maria" replica of the flagship of Christopher Columbus which left Charlottetown on Thursday morning at 7 o'clock in tow of the tug Moulton for Quebec returned to this port at noon yesterday. It appears that the head winds and head tides proved too much for the little tug and she was unable to stem the adverse elements, after getting within three or four miles of Cape Tormentine. After the sun had dipped beneath the horizon the wind became stronger and the tug and the little craft were tossed about in very unpleasant fashion, and instead of making headway both were driven backwards for some distance. It was therefore deemed advisable to put about and the pilot decided to head back to Charlottetown. The ancient looking craft will remain in port until a change in the winds. Yesterday afternoon when it became known that she was again in port large numbers made their way to Conolly's No. 1 Wharf where the Santa Maria is moored and were soon exploring the ship from stem to stern. Should the caravel be in port on Sunday she will doubtless be the means of attracting a great many sight-seers.
