—AT DORCHESTER.— Sheriff McNutt and constable Squarebriggs have returned to Summerside from Dorchester where they took the Prisoner, John Richards. The Sheriff says that it looks as if crime was on the increase instead of decreasing. On Friday, the day they were over, two prisoners were discharged and six received, making a total of 330 at that time, against 290 when he was there about a year ago. He met W. J. Cunningham, and Detective Donahue of St. John at the prison. They brought down five prisoners with them, all shackled together, some of them mere boys but old criminals. He thinks it is a fine thing for the Maritime Provinces that they have such an immense institution, to discipline and to teach this ever increasing crowd of men, nearly all of whom are young, robust, intelligent, looking fellows "doing time" instead of working for themselves, their families and their country. He says that very few who have not been inside the institution realize its enormous size and the amount of work carried on there in the shops and farms in connection with it, most of this work being done by convicts under the supervision of watchful and trusty guards. One thing which struck him most forcibly, was the enormous number of mail-bags used in the provinces for, although the largest number of men employed in any of the shops seemed to be in the tailor shop, yet they could not begin to keep up with the work of mending mail-bags so that the store cutters had to be taken from their work to assist them and the Deputy Warden, L. H. Chambers, through whose courtesy the sheriffs were enabled to see this, informed them that they shipped in one day as many as ten thousand mail bags. The new warden in charge is Mr. Meighen, brother of the Premier of Canada.

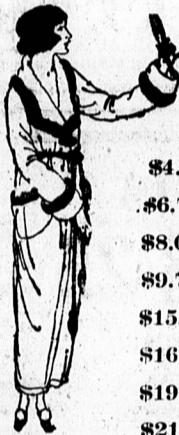
