TWO SERIOUS FIRES.—One of the biggest fires that has been known in Charlottetown took place about 2.30 on Thursday last, resulting in the destruction of two buildings a dwelling house and barn owned by Mr. William Knight and occupied by Mr. A. McIntyre and family. How the fire originated could not be discovered but it is supposed that it was caused by a defective flue. The fire alarm sounded and the fire engines were promptly on hand but the flames had got strong hold and nothing of the two buildings could be saved. Mr. McIntyre succeeded in getting most of his furniture out. A large quantity of hay stored in the barn was destroyed. The firemen were called out Thursday evening as a fire which broke out in a wooden building owned by McKay Bros. The building was formerly used as a carriage factory but for the last three years it has been vacant. About 7.30 smoke was seen coming through the roof. Immediately after the alarm sounded, the firemen were prompt in their response and soon both engines were on the scene. The new engine worked splendidly and the fire was soon extinguished. Had it got away it would have undoubtedly have caused great damage as there are other large buildings within a few feet of it.
