The Maritime Winter Fair.

It is proposed to make the Fat Stock Show to be held at Amherst on the 17th, 18th and 19th of December next, one of the best educational efforts ever attempted on agricultural lines. The Prizes aggregate \$1,918, divided as follows:—For fat cattle in the shorthorn class \$400.00, other breeds of cattle \$450.00, Grade cattle \$17.00, Pure bred sheep \$240.00, Grade sheep \$120.00, sheep carcasses \$24.00, Swine \$120.00, swine carcasses \$28.00, dressed poultry \$85. A considerable number of cattle, sheep and swine are being fitted for this competition and will insure a fine display. Among the cattle will be the sweepstakes steer from the Pan-American Exhibition. In addition to this splendid show of fat cattle there will be a lecture program upon the same lines as that carried out at the Ontario Winter Fair at Guelph, an exhibition which is acknowledged to be the best educational institution on live stock matters in the world. Several of the judges and lecturers will come direct from the Guelph Show to Amherst.
