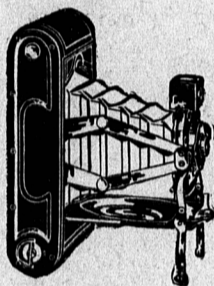

**AUTO TRIP.**—A number of local motorists intend leaving for a motor trip to Halifax on Monday next. They will take their cars across with them and motor through to Scotia's capital. Several of the party are going to attend the convention of the Knights of Pythias that is to be held there. Those who, it is known at present, are to make the trip are Mr. B. Roy Holman, Mr. W. S. Grant, Mr. W. B. Prowse and Mr. S. A. McDonald, each with his own car. They will be preceded by Mr. George Prowse, who with a party, will cross on Saturday and also motor to Halifax in his car.

**DRIVER THROWN.**—Mr. McDonald, of Victoria, met with a severe accident in Charlottetown yesterday afternoon. He was driving a double team, the vehicle being a light wagon, up Prince street. A part of the vehicle broke in front, the horses broke into a gallop and the driver, leaning to one side to see what was wrong, was thrown from the wagon, and becoming entangled in the reins, was dragged along behind the wagon and the galloping horses for a considerable distance before the animals, dashing with the wagon against the parapet, were brought to a standstill. Mr. McDonald's clothes were badly torn; his hands and face were bruised, and he sustained a severe scalp laceration. The wagon was brought up at the corner near the First Methodist Church, and Dr. Ledwell, who lives closely, came to Mr. McDonald's aid.

**ANOTHER CAR.**—The number of motor cars in the Island is fast approaching the half-century mark. Mr. Walter S. Grant is the latest addition to the ranks of local motor car owners. He has just purchased a handsome seven-seater Cadillac car from the Island agent for the Cadillac Company, Mr. B. Roy Holman. This car is registered as No. 47.

**THE DIRECTORS CRIMINALLY NEGLIGENT.**

**WASHINGTON, July 13.**—"One of the most glaring instances of maladministration revealed in all the history of American railroad," is the interstate commerce commission's characterization of its findings in the investigation of New Haven railroad financial affairs, reported today to the Senate.

In a report of thirty thousand words, probably the most drastic in terms of any ever made by the commission, the New Haven's directors were pronounced "criminally negligent."

Evidence pointing to violation of law has been transmitted to the district attorneys in Massachusetts, Rhode Island and New York, and the federal department of justice.

All the commission's strictures were upon the management of the New Haven system under former President Mellen. In justice to the present management, the commission says it is but fair to say that the chairman, Howard Elliott, and special counsel, "have co-operated with the commission and rendered it substantial assistance throughout this investigation."

The report told of millions used like stage money, as corporations in pawn in a monster game with all New England's transportation as a prize, which led the New Haven in the ten years just passed from the height of prosperity to the point where a dividend has been passed, where dissolution suit is threatening, and criminal indictments of many directors who figured in its deals are at least a possibility.

Hampered by unwilling witnesses, by burned books and by all the mazes which lawyers invented to cover the trail, the commission estimated that in the progress toward a monopolization of New England's transportation, the New England stockholders have lost \$65,000,000 and \$49,000,000, but little of which they may recover. On the other hand, the report says, they have on their hands properties which pay no dividends, which eat into the earnings of the parent road, and which will be a burden on its capacity for many years to come.

The combination reared by the hands of Mr. Mellen and approved by the late J. Pierpont Morgan and William Rockefeller, the commission finds to be clearly in violation of the Sherman anti-trust act and a monopoly in practical control of the transportation of five states.
