There departed this life at Hampton, at one o'clock yesterday afternoon, Robert Ince, aged seventy-five years. Mr. Ince, who was one of Hampton's most respected residents, married Elizabeth Hardy of Little York in eighteen sixty-five, and leaves to mourn, beside two brothers, John of Boston, Mass., and Thomas of Hampton and one sister, Mrs. P. Ferguson of Hampton, four sons, Joseph and Hammond of Cape Nome, Alaska, Walter of DeSable, and Fred at home, also one daughter Mrs. Albert Sturdy of Boston Mass. Deceased taught school at Hampton and was also a director of the Hampton cheese factory and clerk of Hampton Lime Co., for a number of years. He was also clerk of the Commissioner's court for some ten years. In 1879 he was appointed clerk of the County Court which position he held till his death. During Mr. Ince's lifetime he took a prominent part in the work of the community, firmly upholding everything industrial educational and beneficial and was highly thought of by those with whom he had occasion to mingle. During Mr. Ince's illness he was frequently visited by Revs. Messrs McLeod and Thomas, who speak most highly of his sterling character and all that pertains to his spiritual welfare.

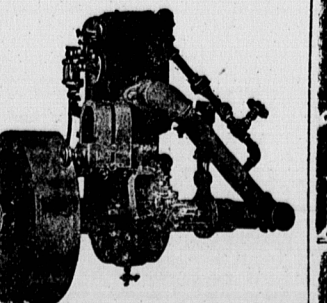
