—The civic election yesterday in Summerside was one of the hottest elections held here for some years the result of which is the return of H. A. Compton to the Mayoralty after a year's absence, by a majority of 36 over the present mayor, A. C. Saunders. The three councillors elected are all new men to civic politics, none of them ever having a seat at the council board before. There were 572 votes cast, out of which there were sixteen spoiled ballots, seven for Compton and four for Saunders. The votes stood for mayor, Compton, 292, Saunders, 260. For councillors, Levi Silliphant, 375; Thomas L. Hinton, 374; Nathan McFarlane, 339; Patrick Ryan, 327; Joseph Cox, 115. After the results had been announced short addresses were made by Mayor elect H. A. Compton, Ex-Mayor Saunders and the councillors elect.

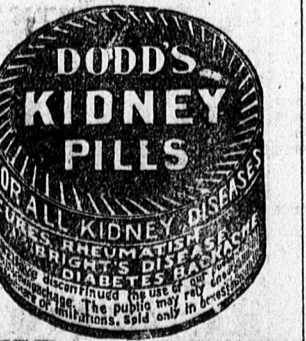
