#### SYSTEM IN GARDENING IS MOST ESSENTIAL.

To Get a Tangible Idea of the Garden-to-be Plan it on Paper.

Everybody at the present time is interested in gardening. Town and city councils have gone at length into the project and are now developing all the vacant land at the disposal of the municipality. Gardening is one of the essentials of the National Thrift campaign that is being furthered from coast to coast.  
 Not the least important impetus to the scheme has been the influence of "Everywoman's World." Through its columns, this monthly has given most valuable hints and instructions for private citizens who intend having gardens this year.  
 In the May issue, W. D. George in an article "My Vegetable Garden This Year," says: "I always plan out my garden on paper, in so much better to have it down in black and white than merely in one's imagination. The planning I do in my head may never get much further, but when I get it all worked out on paper, and estimate, as closely as I can, my requirements in fertilizers, seeds and other things that I know I shall need, I get a much more tangible idea of the garden-to-be, and my plan is in itself an encouragement to go ahead with a will and see the whole thing through to a successful conclusion. I try to avoid having the same crop follow in the same place in the garden as it was in the previous year. I always endeavor to rotate the crops over the garden year after year, since it is believed that one kind of crop takes certain elements from the soil which another one does not. By this rotation of crops we avoid such diseases as Tomato-rot, and others which are brought on by a continual succession of the same kind of plant in the same position."

France April 29, 1917.  
 Dear Friend Ben:—I received your welcome letter a few days ago and was very glad to hear from you and to know you are all well which leaves me the same at present. We are having very nice weather out here now and its about time, for we had a bad enough all winter. What are you doing this Spring farming or fishing? I suppose you are busy. How is everybody getting along. Are there any more of the boys enlisting for I think there is a lot that might. There is still lots of work over here for them to do.

We are giving the Germans these days and show them no mercy and I think by another year we will be all home, those who are spared to see it. There have been a lot of our boys knocked out, one way and another. I thought my time had come several times, but somebody always happened to be handy to dig me out. It would be a great thing for the world if this war was over. Its a wonder that some of the young fellows around home are not ashamed of themselves with so many of us over here fighting and them home loafing. Its not so bad a life after all for I have stood it now sixteen months and feel as good as I ever did, and I am
