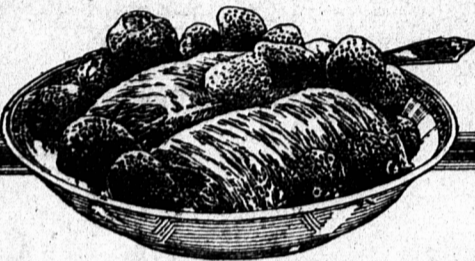

Adrift in Boat: Trying Experience

SYDNEY, N.S., July 20.—After drifting about Cabot Strait for ten days and ten nights in a leaky launch with practically nothing to eat, Captain Sam Squire, and his crew of two, have been landed at North Sydney by the coasting steamer Stella Marris, which took them off St. Paul's Island two days ago.

Captain Squire, Joseph Smeed and Martin Buddin are Newfoundlanders. Two weeks ago they bought a ten-ton launch at Glace Bay and started to sail it to Orbonnar (Nfld.), where they planned to operate a ferry between Orbonnar and Belle Island. The route they proposed was to follow the coast from Glace Bay to Cape North then to Port-Aux-Basques, then down the coast to St. John's.

On the tenth day, with the launch half full of water and about ready to sink they again sighted St. Paul's, off Cape North. By superhuman efforts they managed to keep the boat afloat until it drifted into Campbell's Cove. Captain Squire says that ten minutes more would have finished them as the boat was nearly full of water and the men were too exhausted to swim ashore.

Governor McLeod fed and housed the men until the Stella marris came along. Nothing was known of the affair until today because a vessel recently fouled the Cape-North-St. Paul cable with her anchors and cut the wire to free her.
