SCHOOL BOARD MEETING.—The regular monthly meeting of the City School Board was held last evening. The principals of the three city schools were present and reported upon their work during the past month. The enrollment in the schools for the present year is as follows: Prince Street 355, Queen Square 354, West Kent 328, making a total enrollment of 1037 in the three schools. In addition to the regular routine work the following visiting committees were appointed: West Kent, Messrs. Allen and Johnson; Prince Street, Mr. Gordon and Dr. McMillan; Queen Square, Mr. Smith and Dr. Jenkins.

THE SABLE.—The S. S. Sable arrived in Charlottetown at 10 o'clock yesterday morning. The Sable is a fine specimen of the breed. She sailed in the afternoon for St. John's, Nfld., via the Sydney's, with a large general cargo including, 32 cattle, 50 sheep, one horse, 4000 bags oats, 300 cheese, 200 boxes butter, and a large quantity of sundries such as, eggs, vegetables, etc.
