Quite a number of schooners arrived in port Saturday afternoon and moored at the wharf. Seven vessels in all entered at the customs, and of these four were from P. I. Island with cargoes of produce.—Sydney Record.

Yesterday the price of oysters dropped to \$4.00 and \$4.50 per barrel. There was quite a lot of excitement among some of the oyster dealers over a large shipment that was forwarded to Montreal, and not allowed to be handled on account of their quality. It was rumored they were under seizure and the inspector denounced them.

E. H. Beer of Mark Wright Furnishing Co. and Harry W. Weeks (formerly with Prowse Bros Ltd.) have formed a partnership to carry on the Mark Wright Furnishing Co. In connection with forest preservation, which is yearly becoming more and more a live subject in the Maritime Province, a complete forestry department, large corps of expert rangers and a careful system of reforestation should be of great service. Cutting and planting should be carried on simultaneously so that the forests can never be depleted. At ten year intervals there should be a systematic planting, so that each decade will contribute its regular quota towards the perpetuation of the wood. A hundred and fifty years ago the German forests were practically depleted. Their conditions were very serious, and it took much labor and many years of time to effect a remedy. This work, however, is now well under way, and reforestation is proceeding in an orderly and profitable manner. But it is a task of years, and the country will do well to escape it. Forests should be cut and planted with the regularity of the harvest fields of the farmer.
