On Wednesday afternoon at the Marine Wharf, Summerside, a splendidly arranged program of water sports was carried out under the auspices of the Y's Men's Club.

The meet was well attended by young and old alike and under ideal weather conditions each event was run off to the generous applause of the audience.

The meet demonstrated that there is a large number of young swimmers in Town who are very much at home in the water and much credit for this goes to the Y's Men who have provided suitable swimming facilities at the wharf for young and old alike. The program consisted of swimming races, diving, demonstration of methods of rescue, and to the great amusement of all, a greased pole which the contestants must climb out on and hang on to until the end was reached and a dollar bill tagged.

The presentations were made in the evening at St. Mary's Hall in the presence of Dr. Harvey Doney, Director of First Aid and Water Safety and also Mrs. Harry Cudmore, Director of Red Cross Swimming and Water Safety. Mrs. Goudmore presented bronze medals to swimming instructors, Bill Mills, Don Gallant and Garth Toombs. The meeting was addressed by Dr. Doney, who spoke of the need of a swimming pool in this Province and made interesting comments on the two films which were shown on water safety.

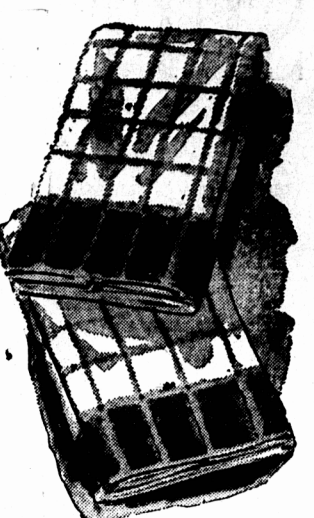
