MORE FIRES - The Charlottetown Fire Brigade had another busy day yesterday and the total number of fires this week is now five. In the morning a small blaze in a house on the corner of Pownall and Sydney streets was extinguished in quick time. About 2 o'clock in the afternoon Police Officer Dominic Doyle while at work in the yard of his home on Spring Park Road, noticed smoke issuing from the hay-loft of his barn and at once rang in the alarm. The building which was repaired only recently, was soon sheathed in flame and all efforts to save it were useless. Adjoining buildings and their roof-rafts ignited by flying sparks and shingles, requiring the constant attention of the firemen. The barn was badly gutted and is a total loss. A -

AMENDMENTS PROPOSED TO CHURCH UNION BILL (Canadian Press) HALIFAX, May 6. - Four amendments have been made to the Church Union Bill by the Legislative Council, before which body of the Legislature the Bill was considered yesterday. These amendments exempt the Presbyterian College at Halifax from the original Bill and the effect of the Union; permit adherents as well as members to vote upon the question of Union; permit churches, which at present dissent from the Union, to vote themselves into the United Church, instead of being legislated in, and then vote out, as the original Bill provides; and as a fourth amendment, which is a new one, provide for another vote to be taken by every congregation of the churches involved in the Union.

FINED FOR VIOLATING BIRD ACT - Seven men from Mills Point, Richmond Bay district appeared before Magistrate Froot of Kensington last week, were convicted and fined for violating the Migratory Birds Convention Act. Fines ranged from ten to twenty-five dollars. Information was laid by Warden Geo. W. McKenzie. The open season for ducks, geese and brant in P. E. I. is from Sept. 1st to Dec. 31st. Shot birds, including only the following: Woodcock, Wilson Snipe, Black-bellied and Golden Plover, Greater and Lesser Yellow Legs, August 15th to Nov. 30th except that on Woodcock and Wilson Snipe Sept. 15th to Nov. 30th. Spring shooting is absolutely prohibited.

COURT OF APPEAL AND SUPREME COURT The Court of Appeal and Equity and the Supreme Court (Easter) term met yesterday forenoon. In the case of the Attorney General vs. the Town of Summerside it was announced that a settlement had been made, and the appeal was therefore dismissed with costs in pursuance with said agreement.

In bankruptcy, the bank appealed from this and the case was tried on April 15th, before the Chief Justice as Judge in Bankruptcy.

The Chief Justice yesterday delivered judgment allowing the claim of the Royal Bank of Canada in full and dismissing the order of disallowance with costs.

The applications for naturalization of Edwin Leslie Harrington and Joseph Davies were approved of by the Chief Justice. The applications of several others are now being considered.

The appeal case of Lords Ltd. vs. Scottish Union National Insurance for non suit for new trial: J. J. Inman K. C., and J. D. Stewart, K. C., for defendant; J. J. Johnson K. C., Bentley, K. C., for applicant, was being heard when the court adjourned till 11.00 a.m. this morning.

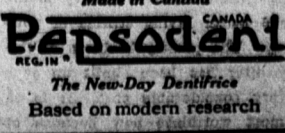
