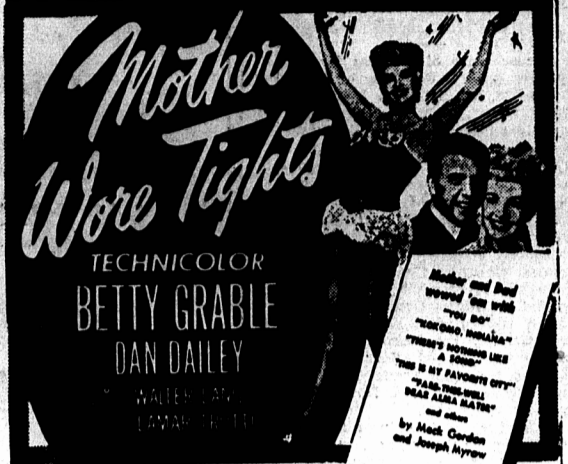

## Palmer Road North House Damaged In Electric Storm

Mrs. Edmund Perry Knocked Unconscious But Not Seriously Injured.

A severe electric storm which visited the northern section of Prince County in the early hours of June 18th caused considerable damage to the dwelling house of Mr. Edmund F. Perry, Palmer Road North, as well as rendering Mrs. Perry unconscious for a short time. The bolt of lightning entered by way of a chimney and took two courses to go out of the house. As it came down the chimney it left practically all the bricks broken or blown into bits. On the second floor it ran along the floor boards to a partition, ripping all boards, plaster, laths and shingles as it went along and finally left the building by ripping a huge hole in the wall directly back of a bed occupied at the time by Mrs. Perry. The lightning set fire to the house as it ripped along on its way. The other course carried right down through the kitchen stove, tearing up the kitchen floor, entering into the cellar and making an exit by tearing out a whole corner of the cement foundation.

It took considerable work to save the house from burning to the ground. Just yet the amount of damage has not been estimated, but from the look of the house, it will surely amount to quite a sum. On or about June 21 the north end of the earth's axis is tipped toward the sun.

## TAKES RECONSTRUCTION.

(Continued from Page 1)

Rustico. Mr. McLure called on Mr. Howe to give some indication if any of the projects suggested by the Provincial Reconstruction Committee would be implemented prior to the end of the session.

"The proposed projects would have been of great benefit to our Province," Mr. McLure pointed out. "I shall mention one which was much in the limelight prior to the last two elections; that is the West Point-Buctouche ferry proposition. The people in Prince Edward Island were not asking for too much."

"They have already secured at Buctouche a guarantee for a landing pier at no cost whatever to the Federal Government. They have also secured the use of two suitable boats for this ferry route, again at no cost to the Federal Government. All they are asking for is that a pier be built at West Point for the benefit of the farmers in that community."

Mr. McLure reminded the House that among Prince Edward Island projects recommended by the Reconstruction Committee were improvements to the harbor at Charlottetown including the building there of a marine railway slip. "I mention these things," he said, "so that we may not be brushed off too easily with regard to the promises that have been made. I, for one, do not intend to be brushed off by these promises which were definitely made by the
