**Hay For Farmers**

Farmers requiring Government hay will please send in their names and addresses either to the Farmers' Institutes in their neighborhood or direct to the Secretary of Agriculture, Mr. John C. Readey, Charlottetown. The object of the Government is by this means to obtain an approximate estimate of the quantity needed, and they require the information in order that they may be in a position to apportion the hay when received.

The Government would request the farmers to ask for only such amount of hay as is actually needed to maintain their stock during the winter. Farmers will be required to pay cash for hay delivered.
