Hints for the Motorist

MEASURING FRONT WHEEL "GATHER"

The most satisfactory way of doing this is to make a sort of caliper or distance stick, which can be kept on hand for this purpose: Take a four-inch wide board about 58 inches long and two strips of lath about 17 inches long. Securely nail one end of one of these strips to the edge of the board at one of its ends and at right angles to it. Fasten one end of the other strip to the other end of the same edge of the board, with a wood screw and washers, so that its angle with the board can be varied, but so that it will stay in position when the screw is tightened. Whittle the outer end of each of the strips into a point. Set the board on the garage floor, in front of the car, with the pointed end of the one strip touching the centre line of one tire, adjust the movable strip so that its pointed end touches the center line of the other tire and screw it firmly in position. Then remove the caliper, pass it carefully under the car, so as not to change the setting, and place the pointed end of one distance strip on the center line of the rear side of one tire, bringing the other point up against the outer tire, which should fall 5-16 or 3/8 inch short of reaching its center line, if the wheel alignment is correct. Without any gage, the alignment can be checked by measuring with a steel tape or stick between the center lines of the two tires, at hub height, in front and then in the same manner at the rear of the wheels and comparing the distance thus obtained.
