### Germany Expects Greece to Enter War

(Canadian Press Despatch.)  
LONDON, Aug. 29.—An Exchange Telegraph despatch from the Hague says that Germany is making preparations for the eventual entry of Greece into the war, which in German diplomatic circles is regarded as certain to take place. A number of Greeks have departed from Germany in the last few days, and to-morrow, the Greek minister in Berlin is to be received by Chancellor Von Bethmann-Hollweg.

### Holland Supplying Food to Germany

(Canadian Press Despatch.)  
LONDON, August 29.—"Holland has been devoting almost all of her spare food products to Germany." The London Post deduces from striking figures drawn from statistics of the Netherlands financial department of export duties which it publishes to-day. The difference between the figures for the first six months 1914 and 1915 is amazing. In butter Holland's export to Germany rose from 8,000 to 19,000 tons; cheese, 6,000 to 46,000; cocoa powder, 1,000 to 3,000; eggs, 8,000 to 20,000 tons; meat, 6,000 to 40,000 tons, and potato flour from 21,000 to 52,000 tons. The exports to England in the same time are no less remarkable. The export of butter fell from 3,652 tons to 97 tons; cheese, 9,702 to 668; cocoa powder, 3,068 to 2,029; eggs, 4,581 to 591; meat, 34,434 to 1,630; potato flour, 15,535 to 6,932.

"The Morning Post argues that these figures mean that Holland which supplied Britain with food in time of peace, deserted her in war and has taken to feeding Germany instead."
