East Malartic, Buffalo-Ankerlie, Little Long Lac, Powell Boyer and Sullivan.

The old Massey-Harris Pfd recovered 2 points to 54 and the new preferred was down 1-4 to 11 1/2. British American and International-A Pete were senior oil gainers and lower prices ruled for the foods, utilities and steels. Sizable fractions were added by Canada Foundry A, Canadian Dredge, Cannors A, Good-year Pfd, Hinde and Dauch and McColl Pfd.

Bell Telephone took a drop of 2-1-2 to 352 and declines of a point or more were noted by Ottawa Car, United Fuel A and Western Canada Flour Pfd.

Nickel, Ventures and Pend Oreille closed down and moderate gains were noted by Falconbridge, Chromium, Sherritt and Noranda.

Calgary and Edmonton weakened 5 cents to 1.30 and Okalta had the same loss to 55.
