MONTREAL, March 7.—Although the stock of Charles Gurd has been quiet for some time it would not be surprising to see it come to life any time now. According to a statement made by the President at the annual meeting, the outlook for this year is favorable, and even in an unfavorable year like 1930 the dividend was earned by a large margin. At current levels, the stock affords a return of 6.7 percent. As the season of heavy consumption of soft drinks is approaching, the stocks of producers of such beverages are likely to come to the fore before long, as the limiting supply of Gurd is small, it takes very little buying to move it up.

The Market Service of the Dominion Fruit Branch reports that bunched new carrots and green cabbage from Texas are almost completely supplanting the home-grown product in popular favour, and this despite the fact that the domestic cabbage and carrots are of better flavour and quality and can be bought for about one-third of the price demanded for the imported article.

WHY A FARM BUDGET

Writing in the Economic Annalist, official organ of the Agricultural Economics Branch, Ottawa, A. E. Gosselin, endorsing the budget systems for farms, says: "Budgets help the farmer to work out the best combination of crops and live stock, to make a good distribution of labour throughout the season, to determine in advance the amount of seed, fertilizers, feed and other supplies likely to be needed during the year, the amount of cash necessary to operate the farm and when it will be needed. Budgets help also in determining the total returns that may be expected, so the necessary financial arrangements may be made to meet living expenses payments of different kinds, and to make the necessary adjustments between the probable expenses, and the estimated returns. Budgeting is a common practice used by commercial firms, public agencies, and Governments. It has also been recommended and used with success by leading farmers of different countries."
