### Children's Aid Society Hold Annual Meeting

(Continued from Page Four.)

character entirely renewed. He is now learning a trade, and gives abundant promises of useful citizenship. If there had been no agency to take practical interest in this youth, the probability is that he would have gone forward on the downward course upon which he had entered.

Within the last four years, ten children who had been placed in the orphanages as wards of the Society, five from each institution, has been transferred by adoption to comfortable foster homes, one in Charlottetown, one in Summerside, and the others in country districts. Two of these children have since died, and so far as we can learn the others are growing up under satisfactory conditions. This Society retains supervision of children so placed until they come of age to look after themselves.

The work of the Society is greatly hampered, and the good which it is calculated to accomplish greatly restricted for the want of a Provincial institution in which youths found guilty in the Juvenile Court of minor criminal offences could be placed under proper reforming influences. Judge Martin, who presides over the Juvenile Court with great patience and acceptance, is often at a loss to know what to do with delinquent boys who are brought before him, and found guilty of wrong doing. The Judge and the Vice Presidents of the Society can further advise in regard to the hardships and difficulties encountered under this head, and which can never be successfully overcome until such time as we have an industrial home of our own. The Society has taken the first steps towards this end, and hope for the co-operation of the Provincial Government and Civic Administration as well as the general public in carrying the matter forward to a successful issue. Then, and only then, can we hope to be in a proper position to reform a small element which, if left to itself, would become a menace to the future well being of the community.

I respectfully ask as many as possible of those present, who are not already members of the Children's Aid Society, to identify themselves with the organization, and thus lend their aid to the good work of reclaiming such of the youth of the city and Province who may from time to time stray away from the path of rectitude.

A resolution was passed commending the excellent work of Sergeant Bradley in handling delinquent children.

Truant Officer McNeill was also present and submitted a report which was also adopted.

Rev. Dr. Fullerton, Rev. Maurice McDonald, Judge Martin of the Juvenile Court, Rev. Canon Simpson, Mayor Wright, Rev. R. G. Fulton and Rev. C. R. Freeman then took part in an interesting discussion in which the need of an Industrial Reform School or schools for this Province was strongly set forth and emphasized.

The two latter speakers also directed attention to the importance of an Abatement of the Cigarette Habit, and to the evil of allowing boys and girls to be on the streets, unattended, after nightfall.

At the close, the committee appointed to wait upon the Government to represent the requirement of Industrial Reform Schools in this Province was, on motion, authorized to wait upon the City Council, for the same purpose at an early date.

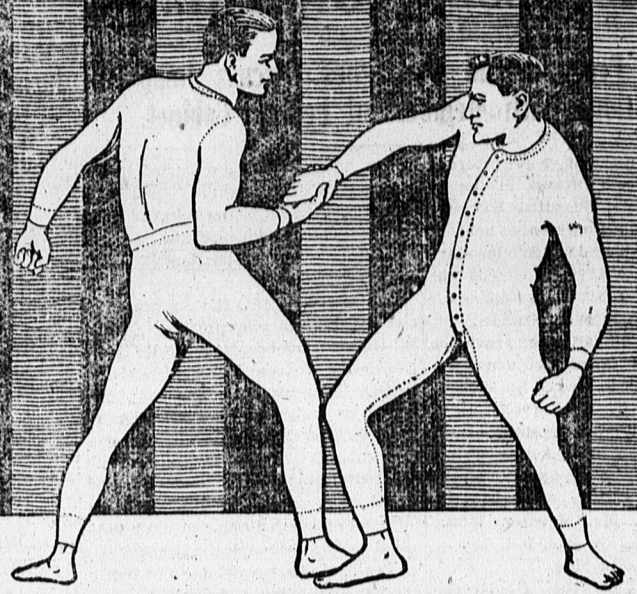

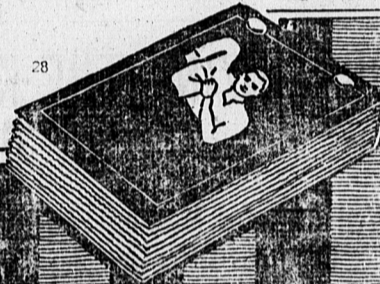

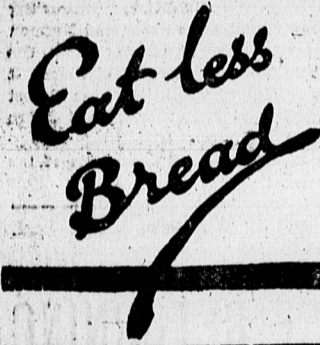

### synopsis of Canadian Northwest Land Regulations

THE sole head of a family or any male over eighteen years old, may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the District. Entry may be made at any Dominion Lands Agency. Duties—Six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres, on certain conditions. A habitable house is required, except where residence is performed in the vicinity. In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section along side his homestead. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties—Six months residence in each of three years after earning homestead patent also 50 acres extra cultivation. Pre-emption patent may be obtained as soon as homestead patent, on certain conditions. A settler who has exhausted his homestead rights may take a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate 50 acres and erect a house worth \$300. The area of cultivation is subject to reduction in case of rough, scrubby or stony land. Live stock may be submitted for cultivation under certain conditions. W. W.
