IN MEMORIAM

JAMES SANDERS

There passed away at Murray River, P. E. I., on December 7th, 1924, James Sanders, in the 82nd year of his age. He was a son of the late Henry Sanders and Margaret Young his wife, and had one sister living Mrs. Catherine Bishop of Murray River. He married Miss Barbara Murdoch daughter of the late J. H. Murdoch also of Murray River. Besides his sorrowing widow he is survived by two sons and four daughters - David J., formerly of Charlottetown, P. E. I., James Robert, on the homestead, Mrs. Jas. Gillespie, of Sask., Mrs. Jas. Gamble of French River, P. E. I., Mrs. Angus Beaton, of Alexandria, P. E. I. and Mrs. Henry Sharnon of Murray Harbour, P. E. I. One son, William, died in the Philippines during the Spanish-American war. In early life, Mr. Sanders engaged in the teaching profession, which he followed until prevented by infirmity. In the capacity of Schoolmaster he occupied a prominent position in the community. This position was well filled, and by his peaceable disposition he endeavored himself to many. He was a devout and consistent member of the Church of Scotland, and loved his teaching and his worship. The funeral was held on Tuesday the 9th. The services were conducted by his pastor Rev. Ewen MacDougall, and the remains were interred in the cemetery at Murray River.

Fossilized Bones Found in Busy London Street

LONDON, Jan. 14.—A collection of fossil bones unearthed in a stratum of sand and gravel 30 feet below the surface soil during excavations of an office building foundation near Charing Cross, one of the busiest traffic centres of London, has been identified by Sir Arthur Keith and R. H. Burne, prominent scientists, as containing the fossilized remains of the hippopotamus, the mammoth, the auroch or great ox, and of a great antlered variety of red deer.

Irish People May Bal-lot On Prohibition

DUBLIN, Jan. 14.—A clash between the Dail Eirann and the Irish Free State Senate over a special provision of the government's liquor traffic control law, is leading various temperance organizations to consider insisting upon a referendum to the people. Such a step is possible because the Free State constitution gives the people the right of referendum in initiating and recalling legislation.

Swedish Armament Plan

STOCKHOLM, Jan. 14.—Plans of deputies to the Swedish Parliament to bring forward measures to reduce armaments and to cut expenses for national defense, may not be carried out, according to political observers, because of the renewed anxiety felt here in regard to the intentions of Soviet Russia.

MANITOBA ECONOMICIZING

BRANDON, Man., Jan. 13.—There will be no new provincial taxes in Manitoba this year, Hon. John Bracken, the Prime Minister, who is back over the Treasury Portfolio from Hon. S. P. M. Black shortly, told the United Farmers of Manitoba last night in the course of his address. The government had to find \$330,000 to meet unexpected claims and losses of revenue, but this would be made somewhere and no new sources of revenue would be sought.

BIG WARSHIP TO BE SUNK IN ATLANTIC

LONDON, Jan. 12.—If conditions are favorable, the battleship Monarch will leave Portsmouth tomorrow to be sunk at sea later, in conformity with the Washington treaty.

Some time will elapse before she is sent to the bottom, as it has been decided that she is to be sunk in the Atlantic, instead of the Channel, as at first arranged. She is to be destroyed by guns and torpedoes of the Atlantic fleet while it is en route from Portland to Gibraltar.
