THE DEATH OF A GOVERNOR.

The necessity of immediately appointing a Lieutenant Governor for Nova Scotia arises from the constitutional provisions of the Canadian Governmental system. The King is really a part of the British Parliament which consists of the Sovereign, the Lords and the Commons. In like manner the Canadian Parliament consists of the Governor General, the Senate and the House of Commons, and a Provincial Legislature like that of Nova Scotia consists of the Lieutenant Governor, the Legislative Council and the House of Assembly.

The Legislature is now in session, but since the death of Lieutenant Governor Jones one important element is wanting. The Ottawa Government has power under ordinary circumstances to appoint an Administrator of the Provincial Government, but his powers are confined to executing "the office and functions of the Lieutenant Governor during his absence, illness or other disability." The Lieutenant Governor being dead "cannot be said to be absent, ill or disabled in the ordinary acceptance of those terms. Hence the necessity for an immediate appointment of a Lieutenant Governor. The situation so far is new and decidedly interesting.

Still another point has been raised and that is as to the validity of any marriage licenses issued during an interregnum. If there is no Lieutenant Governor, actual or potential, how can marriage licenses be issued in his name? People must get married when they get ready. Some of the impatient ones, after the manner of Senator Cox in another affair, "can't wait." It happened on the death of the late Governor Joseph Howe in 1878 the Legislature not being in session that there was an interregnum of a month before his regular successor was named. In the meantime there was an Administrator appointed, but a Nova Scotia Judge who wanted to marry at the time and doubting the validity of the Administrator's license went over to New Brunswick for the necessary document.

THE COMING POSTAL CONGRESS.

The Universal Postal Congress, which has accomplished so great a work in creating international postal facilities since its first meeting in Switzerland in 1875, is shortly to meet in its sixth session at Rome. All the great nations will be represented. One of the subjects to be considered is the creation of an international postage stamp that shall be good anywhere. Another will be an effort to arrive at uniformity with regard to the size and weight of parcels to be carried by mail. Still another matter is the payment for the carriage of mails when sent from one country through another country to a third, as in the case of the British mails for Australia carried through the United States. There are also many minor matters to be settled. Some countries permit and others do not allow of writing other than the address on the front of a postal card. Some of the German states have their own postal systems and German stamps are not good within their borders, nor are the stamps of these states good in other parts of Germany. The general object of the Congress is to obviate existing difficulties and increase the facilities and cheapness of business and social correspondence throughout the world.

The Scott Act is still law in Prince County, just as much as it ever has been and ought to be enforced down to the date of the Order in Council which will some day abrogate it. We hear of violations taking place in various parts of the County which ought to be promptly checked. From information received there is need of information being laid at O'Leary, as well as in other places. It is most undesirable that the traffic shall be allowed to gain headway while the transition from the old law to the new is being made, and to prevent this all violations of the Scott Act in Prince should be dealt with energetically.

A special meeting of the Charlottetown Board of Trade will be held on Thursday night, March 22nd, in the Board of Trade Rooms, when Capt. Ernest Kemp, oyster expert, will read a paper on oyster culture. It is the intention of the Board to deal extensively with this very important subject, collecting from available sources all the information possible bearing on the growth of this industry. In securing the service of Capt. Kemp the Board has acted wisely, and from such a splendid beginning—profitable results must follow. The Guardian would suggest that his elaborate paper may be published in pamphlet form and distributed for the information of those who cannot be present to hear it, and who are taking a lively interest in this important industry.

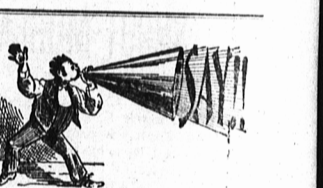
