Such is the Condition of England's Poor Says Miss Barclay, a London Philanthropist—Hon. Mr. Sifton Says Annexation Talk Irritates Canadians.

MONTREAL, May 3.—(Special)—A Special London cable says: "The Canadian Society in London has elected Barlow Cumberland president. The membership is increasing satisfactorily. Lord Strathcona has promised to preside at the first dinner of the society on May 25. It is hoped the society will be successful as it is the only really Canadian organization in London. "A Canadian labor bureau, a private concern, has been established at 11 Charing Cross, with the object of providing an outlet for the surplus of the kingdom to Canada, where the social and climatic conditions are more favorable than in the home land. The concern is prospering. It is prepared to satisfy the Canadian demand for domestics and skilled mechanics and the manager claims that any person employed will be guaranteed a position in Canada. "Miss Barclay, a member of the famous Quaker Banking Company, is organizing a fund to assist desirable youths and

maids to emigrate to Canada. The English quakers have always had the strongest admiration and sympathy for Canada and Canadians. "Miss Barclay said: "I believe that if the poor had the price of the passage millions would leave England. Today one out of every 40 is in a poor house, one of every four is underfed, and under clothed, and wretchedly housed. Another million is wanted to dry up the Atlantic to permit of the depopulation of over-crowded England." Hon. Clifford Sifton made his first public appearance at yesterday's annual dinner of the Royal Colonial Institute. Lord Strathcona was chairman. The Duke of Marlborough proposed the toast of the empire. Mr. Sifton, responding said, that no subject irritated Canadians more than the talk of annexation with the United States. There was a deep national feeling in Canada against it, and said Mr. Sifton, the motherland need fear nothing on that score.

TWO NEGROES LYNCHED. VICKSBURG, Miss., May 3.—Bob Bryant and Will Morris, both colored, arrested for the murder of W. K. Legg, were hanged to the Yaco bridge at Hays Bluff, just before daylight this morning. Bryant had made a confession early Saturday evening, implicating Morris, who he accused of firing the fatal shot. At 11 o'clock last night the negroes were taken from the officers by two hundred farmers, armed with rifles and shotguns, and their bodies were found swinging to the bridge this morning. Robbery was the motive for the murder.

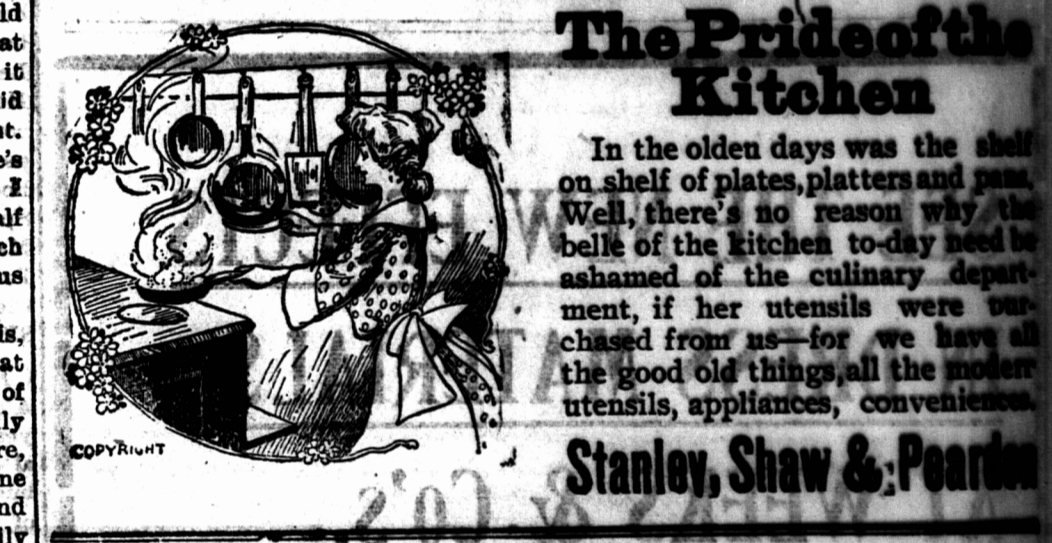
