Johnny Nemis, of Sydney, Maritime welterweight champion, and Bill Burns, a Toronto contender for welter honors, arrived here Saturday. Nemis is slated to swap wallops with Joe Irvine, while Burns is matched with Young Dempsey in another ten rounder on the same card.

Gordon McLeod and Frankie McDonald, both are fast and hard-hitting local boxers, will battle it out in a four rounder with the Island Title at stake. It looks like a gathering of the clan, the Irish and Scotch, to cheer their favorite.

Another preliminary bout which has aroused much interest is the meeting between the Donovan brothers, Alfie and Preston. Brotherly love ceases when this pair of gladiators step into the ring and the fans are assured of a slashing go.

Ed. Acorn will be the referee, with plenty of fireworks. Fans who saw the last go between the East Enders, the Donovan brothers,

modest chap, reports himself in fine condition for any number of rounds and when questioned about his coming clash with Nemis, assured the fans that they will see a fight "Win or lose I'll be in there trying all the time."

Jack McKenna, who is expected here to witness the contest tonight, predicts a win for Nemis. He classifies the Sydney welter as "a true and mighty hard hitter" who is sure to bewilder his opponent by a changed style of fighting. In all probability, he will be installed as a favorite over Irvine, one of the best middleweights in this part of the country. Nemis, at a few hours notice, fought Johnny Anderson, one of the best, at Boston. It went to a draw.

Bill Burns, of Toronto, who is named "the Sheik of boxing", is as fit as a fiddle for his clash with Young Dempsey, an Island favorite. Burns, a good-looking scrapper, is one of those slashing tear-poppers in maps with a sensational style of milking. The only thing is the finding of the button that brings on sleep when the blow lands. He comes here fresh from a six round K. O. over Benny Gaudet of Montreal. While Dempsey says he'll make the grade in the ten round battle with Burns tonight.

It is hard to recall—in fact there never was a time when such general interest was shown in a boxing show, as is evinced from tonight's program at the Strand Theatre. "I have never heard the fans talk so much about any card," says a prominent local physician. Even the ladies seem interested and are expected to turn out in numbers tonight, while many are coming from other parts of the Province. It looks like a sell-out, with standing room like a premium.

The Lieutenant Governor, Mr. Frank R. Hertz, and Staff; His Worship Mayor Miller, members of the Town Council, Chief of Police and other prominent officials have been invited and are expected to attend.

The various candidates for election next Wednesday's contest, are invited to attend and will be introduced from the stage. Arrangements may be made for each candidate to deliver a five minute campaign speech. Several of the candidates have signified their intention of taking in the show.
