French Ready To Take Over Civil Administration

CAEN, Normandy, July 12 (CP Cable) - The Canadian Civil Affairs Staff responsible for administration of civil affairs in Caen, found the local French organization so well prepared that the French have already taken over goodly shares of civil administration.

The Canadian colonel in command of the staff said today that civil affairs aims to hand over administration to the French authorities as soon as they are competent to handle all administrative duties, and in Caen this is being done surprisingly rapidly.

"The French are co-operating beautifully and the help we give them is thankfully received," the colonel said.

Even before the city fell to British and Canadian troops the French in this area had ready a plan which began to function as soon as the Germans were cleared out.

From 2,000 to 3,000 civilians are being evacuated from Caen to Biscay and other ports. This movement is being made entirely by the French in Caen, of whom about 30,000 are going to remain.

The evacuation is not a great medical problem in the city, although in one hospital there are 400 wounded as well as 100 British and six wounded Germans.
