PROVINCIAL PROHIBITION SUS-TAINED.

The good news comes from England that the Judicial Committee of the Privy Council have delivered judgement sustaining the Manitoba Prohibitory Law. It will be remembered that after the law was enacted it was submitted to the Court of King's Bench the Highest Court in the Province, which pronounced it unconstitutional and beyond the power of a provincial Legislature to enact. From this decision an appeal was taken by the Government of Manitoba with the result, as above stated, that the law has been declared valid. We have as yet only the bald announcement and it will be of great interest to read the full text of the decision when it reaches this side of the Atlantic.

The decision is of the utmost importance both generally and locally. It is of vast general importance because it will almost inevitably lead to the enactment of prohibition in the near future by the Legislatures of Ontario, Nova Scotia and New Brunswick, in each of which Provinces there is an undoubted majority of the electorate in favor of the abolition of the liquor traffic. Locally it is of the first importance to the Government and people of Prince Edward Island, as it establishes beyond reasonable doubt that our own Prohibitory Law is also constitutional and valid. The right of Provincial Legislatures to prohibit is now established, and if in any minor section the just powers of the Assembly have been exceeded the defect can easily be cured by amendment. Very probably no such defect will be found to exist, as the Island Act is more carefully guarded in several respects than that of Manitoba which has now been held to be good.

THE GUARDIAN is greatly rejoiced over the decision, the more so as we had all along predicted and confidently expected that the principle of provincial prohibition would be upheld by the court of last resort. Most heartily do we congratulate the Government which framed and the Legislature which enacted our Prohibitory Law, and the people of the Island for whom it was enacted. The decision will give renewed confidence to the friends of prohibition here and throughout Canada, who have fought and labored long to reach the end which has now been attained.

The decision in the Manitoba case so far removes all doubts of the validity of the Island Prohibition Act that we may now hope for and expect a more vigorous prosecution of all offenders against its provisions and an energetic enforcement of its penalties. Better still, may we not hope that the men in the illicit liquor trade who may have hoped that the law would be found unconstitutional, may now accept the inevitable and close out their traffic once and forever. This is a consummation devoutly to be wished for and we hope that in the case of many it may be realized.

At the election held in Galway the other day one Colonel Lynch was selected as the man for Galway defeating Mr. Plunket, a Liberal Unionist supporter of Lord Salisbury. What makes the election of Lynch the more singular is the fact that he is still in South Africa, where he has been fighting against the British armies. He is therefore something more than a pro Boer in the ordinary sense. Of course he cannot take the seat to which he has been elected. His arrest and imprisonment would follow promptly on his appearance on British soil. There can be little doubt under the circumstances that the majority of the electors of Galway are "again" Government.

WORTH SEEING.—Lovers of nature will be repaid today in looking into one of the windows of Messrs. Geo. Carter & Co., Queen Street. The photographic fiend will notice some amateur work, worthy of the best artists. The fiend at fishing will see some snap shots that will make him long for the season to come round again when he may play with the speckled beauties. To those who may not be able to see these pictures we give the following information. Through the kindness of Mr. D. G. Smith, Inspector of Fisheries for Northumberland County, N. B., Mr. Louison obtained two snaps of 12 to 15 pound salmon actually jumping Sycamore Falls, 38 miles from Chatham, N. B. These falls are nine feet high and these excellent snapshots were the best of very many taken during two days' hard amateur work, last September. During the two days in conversation with Mr. Smith this gentleman stated that when the salmon began to jump, he counted 33 jumps in 45 minutes, one of the prettiest scenes he ever witnessed. We trust Mr. Smith may reap much praise for his clever pictures. In order that the public may the more readily see these pictures an enlargement has been made by Messrs. Gauvin & Gentzel, but no copies can be bought of these pictures. In the same window may be noticed amateur work, in views of the strange formation of rocks at Hopewell Cape, near Moncton. Scenes on the celebrated fishing rivers of the Restigouche and Metapedia, near Campbellton and pictures of some catches. Views may be seen of the Sugar Loaf Mountain at Campbellton, N. B., the Tunnel, Morrissey Rock, which the I.O.R., daily runs through and several other interesting New Brunswick views. We feel convinced from what we have seen of these pictures that they are worth inspecting, especially so to the lovers of nature.
