LONDON, Aug. 27.—A despatch to the London Times from Simla, British India, dated Thursday, says the northern Afghan Garrison at Maimana Sherif has mutinied owing to Bolshevik influences. Troops are demanding of the British Government a council of states on the Russian plan.

Critical Condition of Sugar Market

TORONTO, Aug. 27.—President Hugh Blain, opening the wholesale Grocers Convention at the King Edward Hotel today, said that since the war confusion has been worse confounded than ever. Everywhere there was a wall of distress; 'even in our land where plenty abounds.' 'We are pursuing a course of extravagance and thriftlessness. The shock of war seems to have distorted the moral and industrial fibre of the world. The high cost of living is a result of these conditions has been largely attributed to the distributor or so-called 'middleman,' while as a matter of fact their responsibility rests chiefly with the producer,' said Mr. Blain. My experience is that the distributor actually made a lower percentage of profit in his turnover during the war than he did previously.' A telegraphic message was received from J. H. McLaurin, President of the Southern Wholesale Grocers Association of the United States, dated from New York, expressing his regret that he cannot attend the Convention in Toronto, owing to the extremely critical condition of the sugar market in the United States. Mr. McLaurin stated in his message that the sugar market was demoralized and many wholesale grocers throughout the country were threatened with financial ruin. President Blain stated the situation was ten times worse than in Canada.
