Missing Henneon Has Reappeared

(C. F. by Guardian's Special Wire) PARIS, March 27—Georges Henneon who disappeared from his Paris hotel the day Magistrate Prince was murdered, was arrested here today. Authorities hope he may be able to throw some light into the mysterious corners of the Stavisky scandal to which the murder of Prince was linked.

Henneon, held as a material witness, was arrested on information furnished by the manager of the hotel at which he was staying. The hotel-keeper is alleged to have told police of Henneon's sudden accession to wealth. One day he drove up in a fine car and later waving a 1,000 franc note is said to have exclaimed, "well my days of poverty are over now. I've made some good contacts and if all goes properly I'll get a lot of money soon." Then he disappeared.

Paris is waiting for developments in London where British and French agents are co-operating in unravelling the tangle of the Stavisky affair.

Will Utilize Pine Tree For Paper

(A. F. by Guardian's Special Wire) ST. PETERSBURG, Fla., March 27—Southern pine trees can produce 1,500 lbs to the acre of purified cellulose was given to the American Chemical Society today by Dr. Charles H. Herty, former president of the Society.

Purified cellulose can be made into an endless number of products ranging from valuable acids to synthetic clothing fibres. Cellulose of some varieties of northern trees already is going into the manufacture of clothing in competition with cotton.

Dr. Herty described the foundation already erected in white sulphur making and naval stores which can be used by chemists to set up any sort of production from southern trees that future trends of southern agriculture require.

He said the newspaper researchers at the pulp and paper laboratory of the industrial committee of Savannah have removed all doubt as to the practicability of manufacturing newspaper from spruce as a profit, and in competition with northern spruce or any other source of supply.

He retold the story of the Georgia sulphite pulp which was shipped to Canada and made into newspaper; then returned to Georgia and used to print a dozen papers. In this demonstration he said he realized the dream of completely utilizing the pine trees.

He predicted that the thinning of the turpentine forests in the future, instead of going up in smoke, for formerly they were burned, will be used for newspaper. The key to this problem lay in discovery that young pines, now wasted in the process of of thinning naturally seeded forest areas, contain no more resin than northern spruce. Until the southern trees are 30 years old they are free of resin. During this period the thinning can be used for white paper, while the turpentine is taken from the trees allowed to stand.

Finally, after the turpentine cycle is finished, the trees are cut for lumber. This cycle can be continued indefinitely.

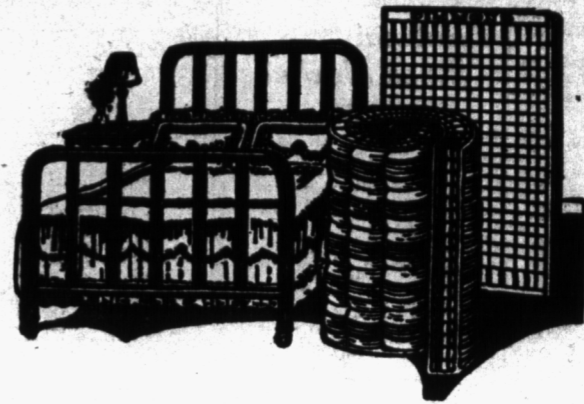

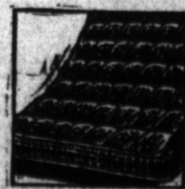
