NEWS AND VIEWS OF THE SPORTS

HALIFAX, Dec. 4.—The Socials have six players so far who will defend their colors in the interprovincial professional league this winter. Yesterday they landed McPherson, the speedy wing artist who played brilliant hockey for the Wanderers last season. "Mac" was one of the fastest skaters in the Nova Scotia amateur league last winter, and his friends were not surprised to learn that Manager Gordon Innor scooped him up. MacPherson will be used as a utility player.

Besides the ex-Wanderers, the Socials have Hilton, Laing, Twaddle, Dunphy and Wilkie. They will probably import two or three upper Canadian players. Up to date Manager Murphy has only secured two men for the Crescents, Frank Condon and "Chummy" Murray. Mr. Murray is negotiating with some upper Canadian players, and will probably bring five or six of these men to Halifax. The Crescents will likely carry three or four utility players.

It is understood that New Glasgow will have "Stonewall" Morrison in goal, with perhaps another maritime artist on the team. It is doubtful however, if the eastern town will use any other players from the sister provinces than Morrison. They are endeavoring to land some men from Ontario and Quebec and will probably secure the services of at least seven upper Canadians.

Moncton will probably play Wortman in goal; Gregory, center; Crockett, left wing, with Norman to fall back on if they are hard up for a forward. The other members of the Victoria aggregation will be imported.

Doran, who played cover-point for the "Vics" last winter, is endeavoring to get a place with the Wanderers of Montreal. If he fails to do this, he will likely spend the winter with his old love—Moncton.

OTTAWA, December 4.—While the coast clubs are taking players from the east, the eastern clubs are going to try their hands picking a few from the west. Eddie King, touted as another Fred Taylor, who hangs out at Calgary, has been recommended to the Ottawa club and the locals will get after him at once. He played with the Settler team, which beat Edmonton for the Pitt-Rivers cup last winter.

King, it is said, was the whole Settler team in that big fellow, weighing somewhere around 180. His Calgary friends wanted him to go to Wanderers, but Ottawa was tipped off first.

The local district likewise has produced its full share. In De Mar, Piggott, Henigan and a host of other locals, the New England district is sure to be well represented.
