On Stock Exchange

MONTREAL, Sept. 25 (CP)—Prices tilted upward and expanded yesterday's partial rallies today on the stock exchange and curb market as trends edged higher in New York. All price groups were marked up in the averages.
Stronger in the paper division fractions to 2 points were Brown Preferred, Fraser, Quebec Pulp Preferred, Great Lakes, Abitibi Common and Preferred, International, Price, St. Lawrence Common, Consolidated, Donnacoma, M. & O., Bathurst "A" and "B" and Brown Common, St. Lawrence "A" and Paper Preferred were up for a time.
Montreal up fractions to 2 1-2 points in industrials were Vickers, Stelco, Asbestos, National Steel Car, Duce, Dominion Hamilton Bridges, Building Products, United Steel, Nuclear, Massey Cannon, Mascon, Woolliers, Fort Canadian Car, Cockshutt and Consumers Glass. Montreal Locomotive converted a loss into a gain. Easter were B. C. Packets Preferred, International Bronze Sugar, Fairchild was weaker in Alcatraz. Ahead in textiles were Colnase and Dominion and Consolidated Textiles stocks. Moving up in liquors were Walker, 4 1-2 "Ermer, Alco "A" and "B", Canadian National Breweries, Melcher Preferred, Sicks and United Distillers. Seagrams was in front for a while.
Better in utilities were Bell, Shawinigan, Brazilian, Power Corporation and Winnipeg Electric. Montreal and Petroleum advanced in Tramways were shaded but Quebec Power recovered from a tumble. Emmerco, Royal and Montreal were winners in banks and C.P.R. and Steamship in carriers.

HAMLET'S GHOST CAN'T BE FOUND ANYWHERE IN ELSINORE CASTLE

ELSINORE, Denmark, Sept. 24—Col. Johannes, governor of Elsinore Castle, says there is no sign of Hamlet's ghost around this ancient fortress which the ghost is supposed to haunt, but there are plenty traces of German—"and that's much worse."
Col. Johannes said his change through the war saved from vandalism a little battered at the edges—the Germans used the castle as a headquarters for anti-aircraft guns. With pride he points to 16th century painting and tapestries in the castle.
"I heard Goering was 'interested' in them but the Germans never got inside this old part of the castle, although they wanted to for five years," he said.
When the army wanted rooms in the castle, the Colonel said he must have a note from the Gestapo. When the Gestapo wanted to enter, the difficulty was the army. But sometimes, to staff off some important German officer, the key to an inner room would be mysteriously missing.
Now that German guns are being torn from the walls outside, leaving only the ancient cannon, the castle, although it is only a shadow of the "Gibraltar of the Baltic," a title it once enjoyed.
