Departure Of Maj. and Mrs. May For British Columbia

A well-known veteran of World War I, Major F. F. May, and Mrs. May, St. Eleanor, left this morning for Nanaimo, British Columbia, where they will reside.

Major May was born and brought up in Charlottetown. He is the son of the late Robert May Jr. His grandfather, Colonel May, had been British Consul at St. Malo, France, for many years.

Major May was educated at St. Peter's Boys School, West Kent, England, and the Charlottetown Business College. He served with the Bank of Nova Scotia in Charlottetown for some time and on leaving the Bank was manager at Chatham, N. B.

When the war broke out in 1914 he was assistant of the Charlottetown Branch of the Bank of Nova Scotia at Saint John, N. B. At that time he was in England with the 25th Battalion Fusiliers, having previously been a member of the Fourth Regiment of Artillery and the Charlottetown Engineer Company.

In September, 1914, Mr. May volunteered as a Lieutenant for overseas service and proceeded to England with the 25th Battalion as a captain. In November, 1915 he was wounded in the fighting at Ypres, Belgium, and was evacuated back to Canada in March, 1916.

He was made Acting Chief Recruiting Officer for Military District No. 7 until appointed Major and second in command of the Depot Battalion, at Saint John, N. B., in the Province of New Brunswick, before the war.

After demobilization in March, 1920, Major May returned for a short period to the service of the Bank of Nova Scotia, until his discharge in 1921. He then returned to Prince Edward Island, settling at St. John's Church there. After taking up residence at St. Eleanor, Major May took an active part in the church life of the community as well as in the affairs of the Canadian Legion, of which he was elected Provincial President in 1935. He is now on the reserve list of the Canadian Legion.

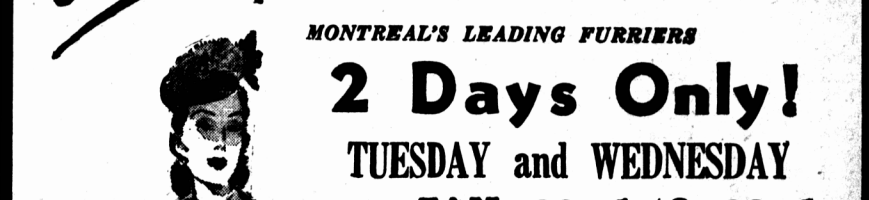
