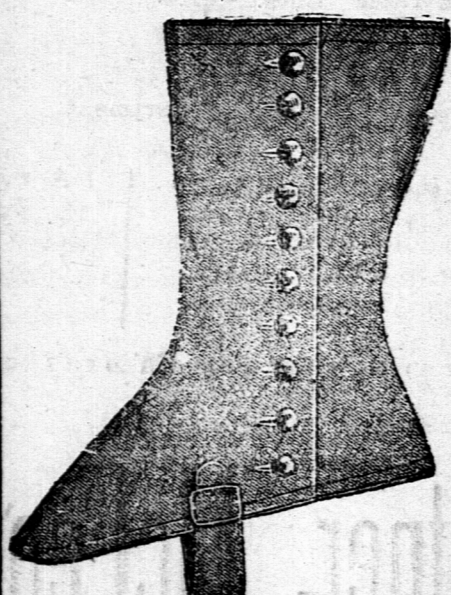

The following regulations were agreed upon previous to the meetings held Thursday night to appoint delegates to Liberal convention to be held on Tuesday next:

1. All voters must be residents of the Poll.
2. All Poll and Royalty meetings to be held on the same night.
3. Nominations to be called for and to be closed by vote.
4. Votes for Delegates to be by ballot in Charlottetown and Royalty.
5. Ballots to be initiated by two men—one each side.
6. Delegate must be a voter of the Poll he represents.
7. No one is entitled to be a Delegate or to vote for a Delegate unless having voted for a Liberal last December as shown by the Poll Book. Provided that nothing herein shall prevent a man voting for or being elected as a Delegate whose name does not appear, but who is known to be a Liberal.
8. Neither of the parties to this agreement shall attend any meeting, whether in Charlottetown, Royalty or elsewhere, for the election of Delegates to attend the Convention.
