

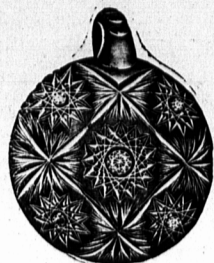

BOYS' JOKES MADE WOMAN SUICIDE

PHILADELPHIA, June 15—Practical jokes by boys caused Miss Ellen Hathaway, of Jessup and Thompson streets, to commit suicide by inhaling gas, neighbors of the dead woman assert. Miss Hathaway was 55 years old and a "character" in the neighborhood. For twenty-five years she had kept a candy store at the corner. She lived alone, and only on rare occasions conversed with her neighbors. The lonely life of the maiden lady was looked upon as a joke by many mischievous youths. The boys frequently rapped on her windows, kicked at the doors and made mysterious noises at the rear of the house. Yesterday morning G. Williams, who lives nearby, noticed that the doors and shutters of Miss Hathaway's house were closed for the first time in many years. He opened one of the shutters and found open a window in the dining room. Miss Hathaway was stretched out on the floor dead. The police believed she turned on the gas before one o'clock yesterday morning. It is said that Miss Hathaway had saved a large amount of money.
