THAT CAR OF YOURS

This is a series of articles pertaining to maintenance and repair of your automobile. We will be glad to answer through this column, questions regarding your car or its mechanism.

CORRECT GEAR CHANGING

Many drivers cause a great deal of noise and injury through improper changing of gears. It is quite wrong to go at high speed in low gear. The same applies to second. The law supplies the limit when in high.

The distance of but a few feet should be travelled in low gear. Just as soon as the car is removed from a standstill, a distance of perhaps three feet, the lever should be gently slid into second gear, and no sooner is it in second than it should be slid into high.

Often a beautiful clutch and transmission is blamed, for the fault of the driver. If you experience trouble with changing gears, or if there is much noise try the above method, but do it gently and moderately slow, then if the noise is still prevalent the adjustment of the clutch should be attended to without delay.
