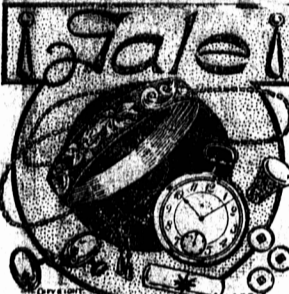

book to book, and perhaps ending in confusion. The book is arranged in the most modern form—that is, all the receipts are given first and then follows the expenditure, with all the details. Although the whole book is not larger than formerly, yet many of the pages contain as much as three times more printed matter than was the case in former years. The whole detail given here is greater than was given in former years. This accounts to a large extent for the delay in producing the volume. We hope in succeeding years no such delay will occur. Some mistakes were made by the printer—some misunderstandings occurred as to the different parts of the book, which required some of the work to be done over, and that contributed also to the delay.

At the same time, I desire to lay on the table of the House the report of the External Auditor on the liabilities of the Province at the 31st December, 1913, setting forth in full the receipts and expenditure for the year ended 31st December, 1913, and also setting forth in detail all the liabilities of the Province on that day. The External Auditor is the Manager of the Bank of Nova Scotia, Mr. Binning.

At the same time also, I desire to lay on the table of the House, in accordance with the statement I made here some days ago, a memorandum of Prince Edward Island's claim to the restoration of her original representation which was presented to the Government of Canada. I also desire to lay on the table of the House the minutes of the proceedings of the conference of the representatives of the Provinces of Canada held in October, 1913.

BILLS PASSED.

Mr. RICHARDS moved the third reading of the Bill entitled an Act to empower the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel in foreign parts to sell certain glebe lands at Fort Hill in township No. 13. The Bill was read accordingly and finally passed.

On the motion of Mr. J. A. Dewar the Bill was read a second time and the incorporation of the J. H. Judson Fox Ranching Co., Ltd., and with Mr. J. H. Myers as chairman, the House resolved itself into committee, considered the Bill clause by clause and agreed to it without amendment. The House resuming, the Bill was engrossed and ordered to a third reading.

The second reading was also taken, on the motion of Hon. Mr. Stewart, of the Bill enabling the Malpeque Curran Island Oyster Co., Ltd., to increase its capital. The House (Mr. L. Jenkins, chairman) then considered the Bill in committee and agreed to it without amendment; the Bill being engrossed and its third reading ordered for the following day.

On the motion of Mr. A. A. McDonald the House resolved itself into committee (chairman, Mr. L. L. Jenkins) for the consideration of a bill to enact the incorporation of the St. Peter's Black Fox Co., Ltd. The bill was reported agreed to without amendment and was ordered to a third reading.

On the motion of Mr. Dobie the House resolved itself into committee (chairman, Mr. Myers) to consider a bill entitled an Act to amend an Act to incorporate the Great River Silver Black Fox Co., Ltd. The bill was ordered to a third reading.

On the motion of Mr. Feehan, the House resolved itself into committee (chairman, Mr. Dewar) to take into consideration a bill to enact the incorporation of the Mermaid Fox Ranching Co. Clause 3 was amended to provide that the company should begin to do business under its corporate name when \$5,000 worth of its capital stock has been paid up, instead of \$10,000 as was originally proposed. The bill was engrossed and ordered to a third reading.

On the motion of Hon. Mr. Dalton a bill to amend the incorporation of the Alberton Glass, Brick was read a third time and passed.

Mr. MYERS moved the third reading of a bill to enact the incorporation of the Argyle Rural Telephone Co., Ltd. The bill was passed.

On the motion of Hon. Mr. Arsenault the House resolved itself into committee (chairman, Mr. Dobie) for the consideration of a bill to enact the incorporation of The Great Eastern Fox & Fur Co., Ltd. In regard to the proposed name of the company Hon. Mr. Arsenault moved that the name be amended by substituting the word "Western" for "Eastern" so as to make the name "The Great Western Fox & Fur Co., Ltd." This amendment, said the mover, was suggested in view of the fact that there was another company with the name "The Eastern Fox & Fur Co., Ltd." and there might be a clashing of the names. The amendment was carried. The chairman of the committee reported progress and asked leave to sit again.

Hon. Mr. ARSENAULT moved the consideration of a bill to enact the incorporation of the United States & Island Silver Black Fox Co., Ltd. The House resolved itself into committee (chairman, Mr. Bunting), Clause 11, which read as follows, was deleted.

"The company may use 'The United States & Island Silver Black Fox Co., Ltd.' as a form of its signature, and the same shall mean, and be binding on the company."

The bill was reported agreed to, engrossed and ordered to a third reading.

On the motion of Hon. Mr. Arsenault a bill to enact the incorporation of the New Anna's Black & Silver Fox Co., Ltd. was read a third time and passed.

On the motion of Hon. Mr. McNeill a bill to enact the incorporation of the Sterns Bros. Ltd., was read a third time and passed.

THE WEATHER.

THE TEMPERATURE, TIDE, MOON, ETC.

(Special to The Guardian) TORONTO, April 8.—Increasing easterly winds; snow or rain. THE WEATHER.—Yesterday was beautifully clear and very mild; at night it continued mild and clear.

The temperature at the midday period yesterday registered 42 degrees above zero and at the lowest 30 above. At nine a. m. it was 33 above and at nine p. m. it was 30 above. The lowest the previous night was 26 above.

The tide will be high this morning at 9.03 and tomorrow at 9.45; it will be high tonight at 9.04 and tomorrow at 10.04.

The sun sets this evening at 6.39 and tomorrow at 6.40; it rises tomorrow morning at 5.25 and Friday at 5.20.

The moon sets tomorrow morning at 4.53. The first quarter of the moon was on Friday, April 3rd at 3.41 p. m. There will be a full moon Friday, April 10th at 9.28 a. m.

The length of today will be thirteen hours and twelve minutes.
