TORONTO, Nov. 12 (CP)—Prices for the Industrials western oils and the Base Metals advanced moderately in the final session of the week and the goods were about steady at the close. Trading was quiet through the greater part of the two-hour session and agricultural turnover was down to 200,000 shares.

DISINFECT TURNIP SEED (Science Service News)
In recent years, black rot of turnips has become more prevalent and in wet seasons causes severe losses to growers in many localities. This situation has, in a measure, been due to the fact that the seed used is contaminated with the seed of this disease. It has been stored for one or two years.
Fortunately, the disease can be controlled satisfactorily by disinfecting the seed before it is planted with either mercuric chloride or semesan, states J. K. Richardson, Dominion Laboratory of Plant Pathology, St. Catharines, Ont.
In 1944 both producers and distributing agencies have given every cooperation by disinfecting the seed before it is planted, though some untreated seed was distributed.
There will probably be a similar situation this spring if the seed is not disinfected. Growers who do not procure disinfected seed will have to treat his own with either mercuric chloride solution or semesan. The liquid treatment is a factory for the control of the disease, but the liquid treatment has given quicker germination and growth under conditions which were not ideal for normal development.
In treating with mercuric chloride (corrosive sublimate) make a solution of 1-4 ounce in 11-2 gallons water in a non-metal container. Tie the seed loosely in a thin cotton or cheesecloth bag and soak in the solution for 30 minutes per 100 lb. of seed. Shake the mixture thoroughly until every seed is coated with the dust then sift over a fine screen to remove the excess disinfectant and wrap in clean paper bags (not the original containers) until ready for use. It is preferable to treat well in advance of planting.
If all seed is thoroughly disinfected before planting black rot will be materially reduced even in seasons when the weather favours its development.
It must be remembered that both these disinfectants are poisonous.

Honored by His Majesty the King



A 33-year-old Chief Engine Room Artificer from Charlottetown, P.E.I., Chief Milford Batchelder, R.C.N.R., was recently formally awarded the British Empire Medal by the King at Buckingham Palace for his work in salvaging a torpedeed tanker and for carrying out his duties loyally and devotedly to duty of the highest traditions of the Royal Canadian Navy.
A veteran seaman who has been going to sea since 1923, Batchelder has a record that few young men can match—more than four years aboard one Canadian fighting ship. He joined the Canadian corvette Mayflower in October, 1940, as a Petty Officer and has served on just about every one of the convoy runs.
His ship came overseas in February 1941, spent a year on the Londonderry-Island run and two years on the Londonderry-Newfoundland run. At one time she had a Canadian ship and on D-Day and on subsequent days she found herself escorting ships and portable harbors across the channel.
Batchelder's citation said that during the salvaging of the torpedeed tanker he was the senior board room rating placed on board and played an important part in steaming the ship for four days to port.
His wife and family of four live at 22 Alley St., Charlottetown.

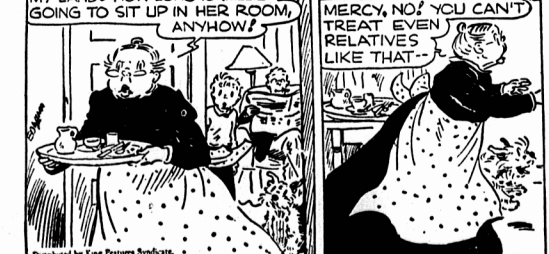
QUICK ON THE JOB
