EASTERN NOTES.

The south east wind of 6th and 7th of April drove all the floating ice on the south side into the bend between East Point and Cape Bear. On the morning of the 8th this body of ice much broken extended about two miles from the shore off Red Point narrowing further east and widening several miles off the deep bays farther west. On the morning of the 8th two herds of seals were plainly visible about 1 1/2 miles off Red Point cove, and their peculiar bark made their presence known to the inhabitants on the shore the night before. Four men veterans of experience on sea and land, John Robertson, John McLellan, Cyrus Stewart and Wallace Stewart, armed with stingers and short guns worked their way with a dory through and over the treacherous ice field till their presence became known to the seals. They considered there were about 100 in each herd, separated by about 100 yards, all large ones and many of them engaged in fierce conflict. In a moment a stir was observed among them each member making for the open water close at hand on every side. A rush was made by the hunters as best they could over the broken ice. Sinder bullets and buck shot were rained among them but dying and desperately wounded seals tumbled into the water with the unhurt and in a few moments not a seal was to be seen. So ended this seal hunt.—Milton Young, foreman in Stewart's steam mill spent Sunday pleasantly at Stias Robertson's.—The roads are in a bad condition. Our mail driver, Charles Young took wheels on the 11th inst., but McLellan's hill is yet untravalled with snow, travellers being compelled to take the adjoining field. The big bridge is up for repairs, and all hands are compelled to go round by Anderson's mills making the road two miles longer.—Extensive preparations are made by our lobster packers, and more traps than ever will fill our waters this season.—At the time of going by mail on the 12th not a particle of ice is to be seen in these waters, the furious north east gales of 10th and 11th clearing out the body on the south side, and I suppose grinding them to pieces on the rocks of Nova Scotia, but while the wind certainly comes off ice fields by its chilly character, none can be very close to us, as on the 11th a mighty old-fashioned surf was pounding our southern coast.
