The prompt handling of their goods by expert judges goes a long way to securing the highest market prices and when the consignments from this Province are received they find a ready market through the above firm who also remit their shippers promptly.

The following taken from the Halifax Maritime Merchant will be of interest to farmers in this Province: "The future price of pork is a gambling speculation these days," said J. F. Fraser, of Davis & Fraser. "At present I am paying 8 1/2c for less than 180 lb stock, but with the memory of what happened last winter in mind, one will naturally be conservative in his purchases. The price a month ago the market was about where it is today, and a good many Canadian packers were induced to stock up at that level of prices. I regret to say that they met with considerable disappointment when the Chicago packers forced the market down to 4 1/2c, and with their low-priced stuff under-sold the Ontario packers in the Canadian market. Mr. Fraser reported that local supplies of hogs were principally from Nova Scotia and New Brunswick. Prince Edward Island is said to have a much shorter crop than last year, some say 10 per cent. less, but no deliveries worth while have been made to packers here as yet. The consumption of all kinds of provisions at the present time is only moderate, due very largely, we fancy, to the high price ruling this summer and to the quickness of trade generally."

Penalties not exceeding \$65.00 may be sued for in a summary manner before two Justices of the Peace for the County. In default of payment or recovery of the penalty the offender is subject to imprisonment.
