A yearling Clydesdale was recently sold in Westfield, New Jersey, for \$5,000. This is supposed to be the highest price ever paid for a yearling Clydesdale.

American horses won nearly all the events in the big trotting meet at Vienna, Austria, from March 19 to April 7. Austria and Russia are now going in for the racing game in earnest. Hundreds of American trotters are being exported to the European countries, and to Australia and New Zealand where the trotting fever has taken a firm hold.

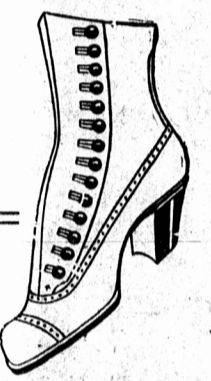

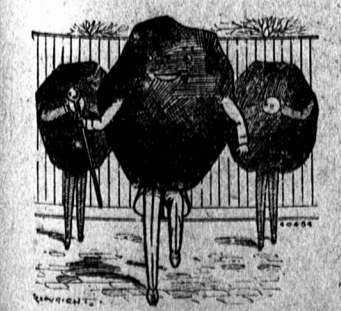

SPAIN IS TO HAVE A STRONG NAVY

MADRID, May 9.—Admiral Miranda, minister of marine, Thursday tabled a bill providing for an annual credit of \$7,200,000 over a period of nine years, to be used exclusively in the building of warships. Under the provision of the bill it was intended to develop the Spanish arsenal so as to avoid having to use foreign builders in construction of battleships. The minister of marine expects that a battleship to be laid down in 1917 will be built entirely by Spaniards and with Spanish materials.
