40th Annual Statement Reviewed By Hon. G. H. Ferguson, President CANADIAN BUSINESS INCREASES 10%

TORONTO—Stating that forty years of service have won for the Crown Life honorably placed in the life insurance industry, Hon. G. H. Ferguson, president, announced at the company's 40th annual meeting, held in Toronto last week, that the life insurance industry in Canada has had a new record total of \$233,154,019.00 in 1940 from \$219,883,324.043 in 1939.

Investment Rate Well Up

The average rate of interest earned in 1940 was 4.73 per cent. The report stated that this was a very satisfactory rate in view of the high character of the investments.

Big Increase in Income

Total cash income for 1940 was \$9,876,309.94, compared with \$9,434,407.34 in the preceding year. Premium income was \$7,500,430.85 of the total investment income contributed \$1,770,337.00.

Surplus at New High

Surplus resulting from the year's operations was \$88,711,716.07, which is a record for the company. The surplus is the result of the company's conservative policy.
