**MANUAL TRAINING IN SCHOOL.**

Prof. Robertson Agricultural and Dairy Commissioner, Ottawa addressed the Ontario Educational Association last week on manual training. Some sixteen schools for illustrating this movement have been established in Canada through the generosity of Sir Wm. C. McDonald. It is not intended to locate any more, a sufficient number having been established to give educationalists in different parts of the Dominion a clear idea of what this system will do in training and developing the minds of the young.

Prof. Robertson also outlined to the school inspectors present a plan along a somewhat similar line for influencing the teachings in rural schools more along agricultural lines. No definite proposal was made but merely a discussion to ascertain if such a scheme as is to be found in Germany were feasible in Canada. If so Sir Wm. C. McDonald is prepared to donate a sufficient sum to introduce the system in this country.

**THE RAISING OF HOGS**

**75 Per Cent Imported From Abroad Instead of Being Raised at Home.**

The Herald has frequently called attention to the well-known fact that Nova Scotia sends away hundreds of thousands of dollars for food products that our own farmers should raise. The subjoined circular, sent out this season by a pork-packing firm in this city, shows the splendid opportunity there is for our farmers in the hog business:

To the farmers of Nova Scotia:—We beg to inform you that we are in the pork packing business and want hogs raised in Nova Scotia, if you can raise them. On only drawback at the present time is scarcity of hogs. We are getting over 75 per cent. of what we use from Ontario and P. E. Island, and unless we see that you are going to raise more we will have to go where they are raised. We feel, however, that you do not know that we can use any quantity and that as soon as you find you can sell to good advantage, you will raise all we want; as it must be profitable to you to do so. It is to inform you we want them that we issue this circular. We will agree to buy five, ten, or twenty thousand this coming season at best market prices and arrange to take delivery and pay cash for same at your nearest railway station. We are sending the circular to the secretary of your agricultural society, and will arrange with him or some merchants to receive and pay cash for your hogs when ready for shipment. Each society should have at least one to two hundred to sell to commence this season, and this would only average two or three for each member. Some members can no doubt raise fifty. There will not be too many; raise all you can. We want bacon hogs say five or six months old, that will weigh when dressed 125 to 175 pounds. Heavier or lighter are worth 3 to 1 cent per pound less than the best bacon hogs, and whilst a few will sell, a large quantity are unsaleable. At present there are so few in the province we are compelled to buy them dressed during the cold season, from September to May, but should we be able to secure even 50 per day for a year, we would then arrange to purchase live. We are offering a prize of fifteen dollars (\$15) for the best three bacon hogs exhibited at the provincial exhibition to be held here in September, and will buy them if the exhibitor desires.

PARIS, April 19.—The officials of the French foreign office say that France's Chinese indemnity claim amounts to \$40,000,000.

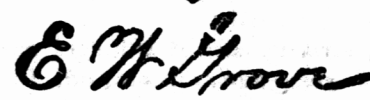
