## ALL NEWS OF LOCAL INTEREST

Rev. Dr. Hertz preached yesterday afternoon in Hertz's Hall.

The funeral of the late Mrs. William W. Dockendorff takes place today from her late home North River.

On Friday night the grocery store conducted in the Lyceum by Michael Duffy was burglarized and a quantity of canned goods, cheese, etc., removed. The store was entered by the removal of a large glass in the door on Prince Street.

The friends of the Methodist Church at Cherry Valley, held a successful social on Wednesday and the proceeds with two subscriptions from tried and generous supporters, paid off the balance of the debt on the church. During the last three years three hundred and fifty dollars has been raised for this purpose.

The July term of the Supreme Court opens in Georgetown tomorrow. Chief Justice Sullivan leaves this afternoon to preside. S. of Vernon River, of which Mrs. Wass was president, and also from that of Cherry Valley, waited on Mrs. Wass and in a few appropriate words presented her with a generous sum of money, which was received with hearty appreciation.

We are also very pleased to hear that the freight shipments are likely to be very good considering that this is the first trip of the steamer.

THERE passed away at her late home North River on Friday night, 11th inst. Harriet E. Carter beloved wife of William W. Dockendorff sr. in her 62nd year. Deceased had been in delicate health for some time, so that to her friends her death was not unexpected. She leaves to mourn a husband, son and daughter besides brothers sisters and a host of other relatives and friends. The sisters are Mrs. Philip Newsom, Charlottetown, Mrs. Robinson Warren North River, Mrs. Bruce Stewart, City. The brothers are Messrs. W. F. Carter City and T. B. Carter Cambelton New Brunswick.

THE outbuildings owned by John F. McMillan, Brasley Point Road were, with all their contents, including a horse owned by Mr. Jeremiah Jackson, totally destroyed by fire yesterday afternoon. It appears that a boy about seven years of age took it into his head to set fire to a hen's nest in one of the buildings and the result was the total destruction of all the outbuildings and a loss to the boy's father of somewhere in the vicinity of \$1500 less \$400 insurance. The loss to Mr. McMillan is a severe one and had it not been for the energetic assistance of his neighbor, who came and fought the fire, his dwelling house would have gone. The horse owned by Mr. Jackson had strayed into one of the buildings and it was impossible to get him out. In fact one man was nearly suffocated in endeavoring to save him. Mr. MacMillan has the sympathy of his neighbors in his loss.

#### GERMANY READY TO BUY.

LISBON, July 11.—A rumor is in circulation here that Germany has offered to purchase from Portugal a portion of the dependency of Macao, in China, for \$5,000,000. The Portuguese dependency of Macao is situated on an island at the mouth of the Canton river. It is 30 miles from Hong Kong, is two and one-half miles in length, by less than a mile in breadth.
