## SONS OF TEMPERANCE INVITED TO G. A. R. BANQUET

SOUTH MANCHESTER, July 19.—Philadelphia. Considerable preliminary business was disposed of at the first session of the national convention of the Sons of Temperance of North America, which opened in the parish hall of the Center Congregational church Wednesday afternoon at 3 o'clock. That the local committees had done admirable preparatory work was evidenced by the systematic way in which the arriving guests were escorted to their quarters and the attractiveness of the interior of the parish hall, which was simply but attractively decorated with United States flags, and across the center of the platform hung an illuminated sign reading, "Welcome."

Promptly at 3 o'clock yesterday afternoon, the Rev. George A. Lawson of Moncton, N. B., most worthy patriarch, who will preside throughout the convention, called the assembly to order and the annual reports of officers were submitted. A committee consisting of J. O. McCarthy, R. E. Eavenson and Albert G. Lawson was appointed to arrange for the distribution of officers' reports. The only officer unable to attend was the Rev. Charles Flemington of New Brunswick, chaplain of the organization. When the roll-call was taken, shortly after the convention had been formally opened, the many respondents, including J. G. Brodie from Prince Edward Island.

The following pages were appointed: Louis Lester Hohenthal and Miss Ethel Faulkner, from Connecticut, and Willis Blessing of New Jersey. A committee consisting of the following was appointed to consider the advisability of dividing the state of New Jersey by establishing another grand lodge in southern New Jersey: J. O. McCarthy, Roland Eavenson, E. R. Nickerson, the Rev. Alfred Noon and E. L. G. Hohenthal. Standing committees were appointed as follows: Publications and Literature, the Rev. A. P. Brace, John W. Cummings, J. J. Anslow, Shubath Daniels and W. P. Compton.

## CRUSHED TO DEATH AT STREET CAR CROSSING.

MONTREAL, July 23.—Mrs. Hormisus Peladeau, 582 Colonial Ave., lies dead at the morgue, while her husband is in a critical condition at the Royal Victoria Hospital, as the result of a street car accident at the corner of Marchmont Ave. and Queen Mary's Road today. The couple were walking up Marchmont Ave. and at Queen Mary's Road stopped to let an eastbound car pass. They hurried on, failing to notice a rapidly approaching westbound car, and were literally under the wheels before the motor-man could see them. The woman was hurled 100 feet and her skull was fractured. The man was picked up 150 feet away in an unconscious condition, with both legs broken and one side of his face smashed to a pulp. There is little hope for his recovery.

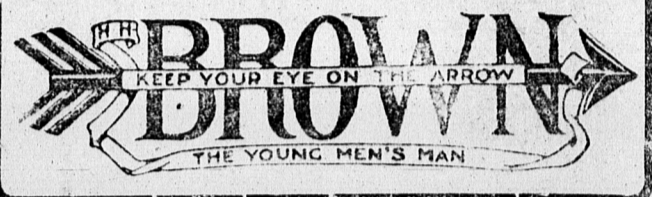
