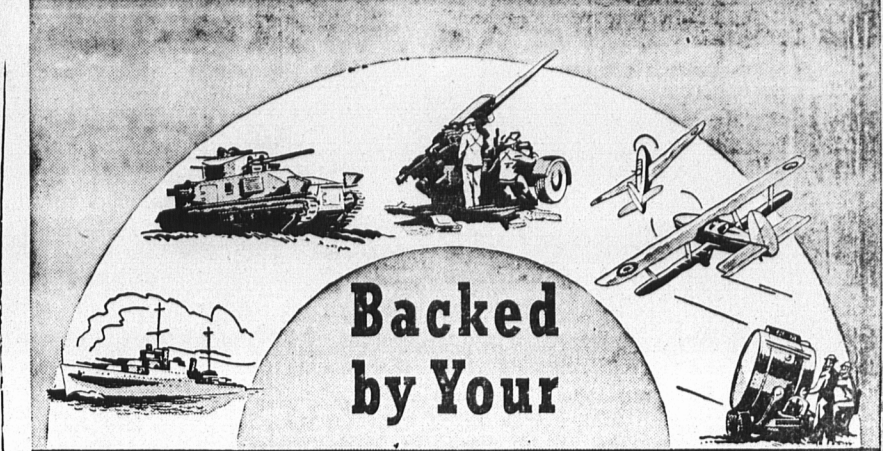

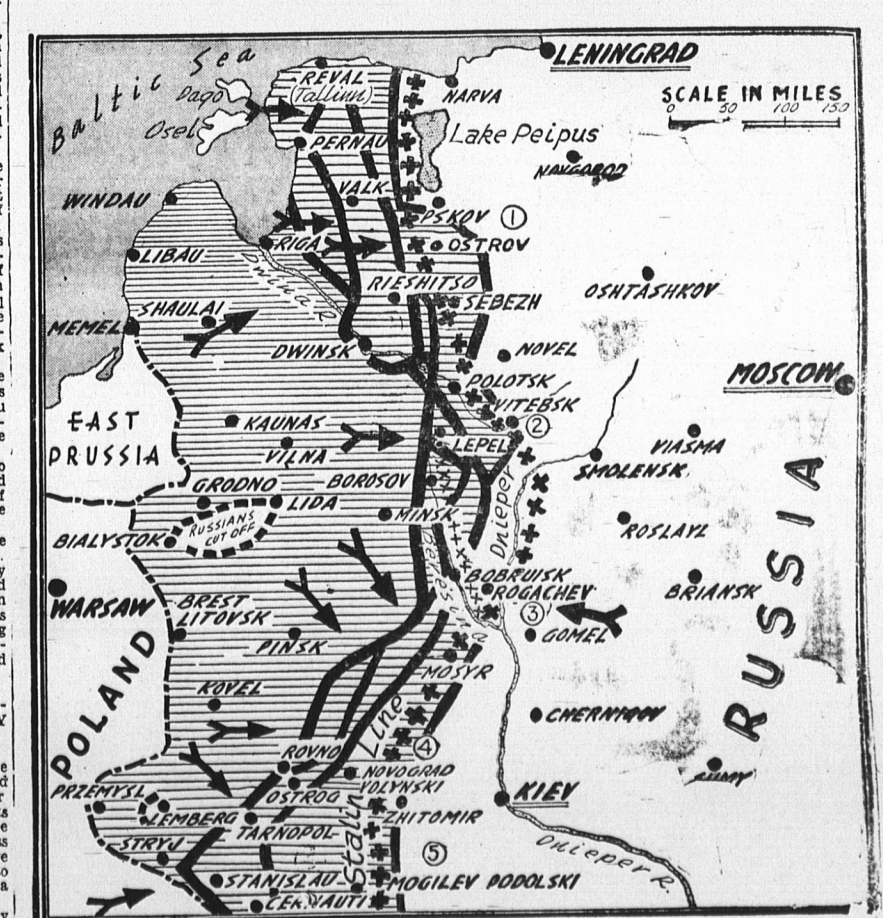

TODAY'S WAR MAP



The fourth week of the Russian war finds the Russian army seriously weakened by heavy losses of men and material which, regardless of what either side may say, probably are at least two to one in favor of the Germans. The quickness or slowness with which the vast reserves of Russian manpower and equipment can be brought into play may determine the outcome of the fighting. The Germans have worked their way through several parts of the Stalin line, but not, it would seem, at the most vital points. Just when they think the worst of their troubles are over and that the Russian armies are about to disintegrate, the Russians strike back hard with newly assembled tank forces and bombing and fighter planes. On the map the figures indicate (1) German drive east of Lake Peipus and are defeated in a Russian counter-attack; (2) little change in the Vitebsk sector; (3) Russians held ground at Rogachev; (4) and (5) German tank forces break through Russian front in Kiev sector, but are themselves surrounded. Here the situation is critical, if obscure. The German tank forces have been off for several days. The black oblongs suggest German tank forces.
