### Synopsis of Canadian Northwest Land Regulations

PHC, sole head of a family or any sole over eighteen years old, may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the District. Entry by proxy may be made at any Dominion Lands Agency but not Sub-Agency on certain conditions. Duties—Six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres, on certain conditions. A habitable house is required except where residence is performed in the vicinity. In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section alone side his homestead. Price \$5.00 per acre. Duties—Six months residence in each of three years after earning homestead patent; also 50 acres extra cultivation. Pre-emption patent may be obtained as soon as homestead is performed on certain conditions. A settler who has exhausted his homestead right may take a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$5.00 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years cultivate 50 acres and erect a house worth \$2000. The area surrounding is subject to reversion in case of rough, scrubby or stony land. Live stock may be substituted for cultivation under certain conditions. W. W. CUNY, G. S. ### MEETING OF P. E. I. PRESBYTERY

At Charlottetown and within the hall of Zion Church, there on Tuesday March sixth, nineteen hundred and seventeen and, at eleven o'clock forenoon—

At which place and time the Presbytery of Prince Edward Island met and was constituted. Mr. Robert Murray, moderator pro tempore; with whom were present, Messrs. Dr. Fullerton, George Millar, R. Davidson, John Stirling, and D. McLean, ministers and Messrs. D. S. Schurman and T. C. James, elders.

On motion the action of the moderator and clerk in calling this meeting at eleven o'clock forenoon, instead of two o'clock afternoon, was sustained.

Mr. G. W. Irvine was elected moderator for the ensuing six months, and Mr. T. C. James, clerk, for the year. Minutes of meetings held November seventh, November twentieth, and December nineteenth, nineteen hundred and sixteen and on January eleventh and sixteenth, nineteen hundred and seventeen, were read and approved.

In the minute of November seventh the item, "Bill for two hundred and sixty six ninety one Richmond Bay West forwarded to Home Board. This item was passed at a previous meeting and inadvertently omitted from the minutes, it was inserted in the minute to substantiate authority to make this claim on the Home Mission Board.

Presbytery took up the call from Summerside to Rev. G. E. Mitchell. Dr. Fullerton explained that owing to the storm all trains were cancelled and that it was therefore impossible for the Interim Moderator and Commissioners to appear before the Presbytery. He gave the following particulars, received by telephone, from Summerside:—

Rev. W. A. McQuarrie, moderated in a call at Summerside, March fifth, which came out unanimously and enthusiastically in favor of Rev. G. E. Mitchell. It was signed by two hundred and nine communicants and one hundred and fifty-seven adherents, and was accompanied by a guarantee of twelve hundred dollars stipulated with a manse and one month's vacation.

On motion the conduct of the moderator was sustained, and Dr. Fullerton representing Messrs. T. Ramsay and Major Townsend of the session, Wm. Hunter, of the trustees and Mr. Calder and G. Rogers of the young people of the Summerside congregation was heard. He represented to the Presbytery that according to the statements made to him the call was perfectly harmonious and enthusiastic.

On motion the call was sustained as a regular Gospel call and the clerk was instructed to forward it to Mr. Mitchell, at Pictou, Nova Scotia.

The following provisional arrangements were made for Mr. Mitchell's induction:—

The moderator of Presbytery to preside and induct; Mr. Goodwill to be the minister; and Mr. W. A. McQuarrie the people. Serving the edict, was entrusted to Mr. D. McLean. Time of induction to be fixed by the clerk after correspondence.

The clerk read the report of the committee to strike standing committees, which was adopted by Presbytery, and is as follows:

**ALLIED CAMPS AT SALONICA SHELLED BY GERMANS**  
SALONICA, March 4.—The Germans are making aeroplane raids on a larger scale. During the last few days Janesh and Karesuli villages near the front were bombed. To-day 15 Albattrosses appeared over the allied camps at Salonica and dropped bombs. This was the first bombing raid here in ten months. The material damage seems to have been one motor lorry burned. The raiders paid toll for their exploit, one of their machines being brought down by an allied air man on the way back to the frontier and the German officer and pilot were taken prisoner.

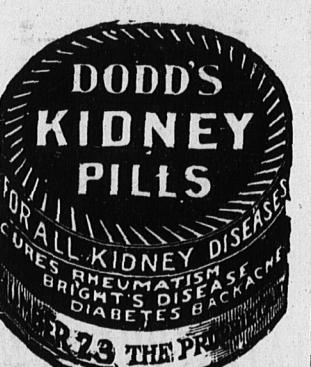
