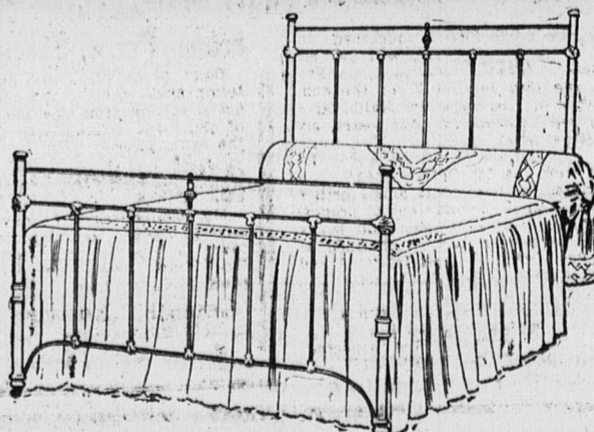

BLONDIN HOPEFUL FOR QUEBEC

(Canadian Press Despatch.) OTTAWA (Canadian Press)—"If both parties agree on conscription," said Lieut.-Col. Hon. P. E. Blondin, today, "there will be very little trouble enforcing it in the province of Quebec. I am not worrying over that agitation down there. As soon as the people of my province understand that both parties are making conscription and united to carry the war to a successful issue, there will be little opposition to conscription. The campaign of General Lessard and myself has resulted in a great change in opinion on the military situation."

MR. FRANCIS TRAINOR

There passed peacefully away at his home in St. Ann's Hope River, on May 18th, Mr. Francis Trainor, at the advanced age of 81 years. Deceased gentleman emigrated in 1842 from County Monaghan, Ireland, with his parents, and carried on his occupation as a farmer until within the past few years when his health forced him to give up his more active duties. In 1863 he married Catherine Callaghan, of Palmer's Road, who preceded him about a year ago. A family of one son, John, on the home-stand, and one daughter, Mary Ellen, widow of Mr. Moses Welsh, and a grand-daughter, Mamie Trainor, are left to mourn the loss of a loving father; also a sister, Mrs. Mooney, who resides in Oldtown, Maine. A life-long resident of Hope River, his home was always a place of pitiable cheer for young and old, and his bright and genial manner made him the centre of the home. In his last illness he was attended by his pastor, Father Gaudet, and died fortified by the rites of his beloved church. The funeral on Sunday afternoon was largely attended by neighbors, anxious to pay a last tribute of respect to a revered friend. The pall-bearers were, Messrs Wm. Hogan, Jeremiah O'Connor, Patrick Doyle, James Malone, Clement Trainor, and Patrick Murphy. "Eternal rest grant to him, Oh, Lord."
