Of Stylish Creations in Spring Millinery.

### OPENING OF BONNETS

And Advance Easter Hats at James Paton & Co's.

The interior decorations are of an elaborate high order. Following are a few of the many pretty hats and bonnets shown as seen by Aunt Kate last Thursday evening and which demonstrates that even Madame's Hat can be made home made for home trade. Miss King is Charlottetown's own milliner. A very nobby automobile turban was of reseda green in two shades, the crown draped with Arab lace and decorated with a spray of rich velvet leaves shading from green at the stems to pink and a dull red at the edges. The under brim was faced with grape leaves, in their natural tints and the deep bandana was wreathed with white, red, green and purple grapes in natural sizes.

### FRUIT PREDOMINATES.

In dress hats, among other pretty things noted, was a box turban made entirely of blue velvet forget-me-nots. This was a very dainty hat to go with a reception toilet. In black hats a novel conceit was a deep black turban of chiffon. Instead of the gophered chiffon that has been worn so long, it was closely knife-pleated and when wound round the hat it presented long serpentine curves that were very graceful. The single decoration was an algerette of ostrich feathers from which rose a black and white osprey. In all white a pretty reception hat was developed in white stocks sewed close together over the wide crown and outer brim. The facing was of twisted maline and the decorations sash ends of white velvet and ospreys.

### ANOTHER CHIC HAT

A very chic hat is a Cuban weave of burnt straw, the brim is slightly rolled in front and sheer up at the back. The crown is strapped with cherry velvet, held in front with a long band of cut steel, the velvet is carried over the brim at the back and attractively arranged in the form of leaves and a wreath of beautiful French roses in varying shades of red surrounds the crown.

### AN ODD AND PRETTY HAT.

An odd and pretty hat was of oorn flower blue and white. The deep brim of the blue with a white crown and most striking decoration is made of the little old fashioned blue bachelor's buttons. They have the appearance of being cut with very long stems, tied in bunches with white satin ribbon and then draped on the hat. The result is extremely good. A large burnt leghorn hat showed a brim facing of Irish lace over orange chiffon, round the edge of this is set a wreath of tiny black daisies, the crown has a wreath of the flowers and is strapped with soft bands of cowslip yellow ribbon caught with black aigrettes.

### CHIC MISTERS' HATS.

In Misters' hats some very pretty things were shown. A wide burnt leghorn had the brim rolled and draped with strawberry pink covered with lace in the same shape as the hat, the lace scarf was caught at the back with a great cluster of double morning glories, shading from pale pink to pinkish brown, while across the crown was a long bar of cut jet. Another pretty hat for a young girl was of heavy Irish lace on a skeleton frame, the edge of the brim was bound with poppy red, a band of the same surrounded the crown and four soft rosettes of silk in the same shade finished the decorations.

### SHIRT WAIST HATS.

This house is certainly specializing in shirt waist hats and some of those shown are very chic indeed. One model noted was of cream white shaving straw, veiled with chiffon, the brim is clasped to the crown at the back with large square buckles of the straw that hold in shape a triple band of Champagne, Toreador and Castor ribbon. An other showing of this line was a military turban of variegated fancy straw in shades running through wood brown, burnt orange to cornflower blue, the decorations were a pair of blue satin ribbon and rosettes of soft brown silk. A very large number of combinations of black and white, steel grey and white and all black hats were shown under the title of shirt waist or semi-dress hats.
