Apple-Scotch Pie 1-2 cups brown sugar 1 cup water 2 teaspoons vinegar 7 cups sliced apples 1-2 cup flour 1-8 teaspoon salt 2 tablespoons butter 1 teaspoon vanilla extract 1 recipe all-bran pastry

Combine 3-4 cup sugar, water, and vinegar; bring to a boil. Add apples and simmer until tender. Remove apples and cool. Combine remaining sugar, flour and salt and add to syrup. Mix well; cook until thick, stirring constantly. Add butter and flavoring. Cool. Place apples in pie pan lined with all-bran pastry. Pour syrup over top. Fill with meringue with meringue strips over surface. Bake in moderately hot oven (425 degrees F.) about 35 minutes. Yield: One 9-inch pie.
