WHY DOES AN IRON SHIP FLOAT?

Men used to think that a ship had to be made of wood in order to float, because wood floats and iron sinks. But now, all big ships are built of iron. Why do they not sink like a stone? It is because of their shape. When they are hollowed out the whole space they occupy is filled with air, which makes the ship, as a whole, lighter than water, so it floats. You can even put things into it, but the more you put in, the deeper your ship rides in the water. You can store iron in it, but if you packed it full of iron, or anything heavier than water, it would sink.

One brave man fought for years for the lives of sailors, and at last got a law made that a line should be painted outside the hulls of ships, and that the ship must not be packed so heavily as to sink that line below the surface of the water. Like many others who did good things, he was laughed at, but his name will always be remembered, and that line, which protects sailors, will always be called Plineus's line in his memory.

A HERO.

During the civil war in the United States, which was fought for the sake of securing freedom for the slaves in the Southern States, there was great consternation in the Southern city of Memphis in Tennessee. This city had been occupied by an army of the North in the summer of 1864, and an officer of this army had been assassinated. The general of the Northern army promptly condemned ten of the principal inhabitants to be shot, saying that the city was responsible for the lives of his men.

Nine of these selected ten was the father of a large family, and his death would have caused great suffering and hardship to his wife and children. A young man, not related to him in any way, came forward and insisted upon being taken in his place, saying that his life was less valuable than the one on whose life so many others depended. And so, great as was the distress of the older man, his generous offer was accepted, and not only spared a father to his children, but showed how there is self-sacrifice even in barbarous times.

FIRES IN CANADA IN FEBRUARY

TORONTO, Mar. 1—Canada's fire loss during February, as estimated by the Montgomery Times, in its current issue, amounted to \$1,640,153, compared with January's loss of \$3,002,650, and \$941,045 in February of last year. Fires exceeding \$10,000 numbered 19 in February, the worst being the Sugar Refinery in Halifax, where the loss was \$624,470. The number of deaths from fire is the lowest since September, 1910, the number being 11.

HERBERT CASE AGAIN TO FRONT

MONTREAL, March 1—The Herbert Cloutier marriage annulment case, enters a second stage today, when the attorneys for Herbert will subscribe the whole matter, for hearing, before the Court of Review. It was the intention to have the case brought immediately to the Court of Appeals, but the heavy costs deterred the legal representatives of Mr. Herbert, from taking such a course just yet. They will content themselves with having the case brought to the attention of the Court of Review where the whole record, including the lengthy finding of Mr. Justice Charbonneau will be submitted to the consideration of three judges of the Superior Court, called upon by the Chief Justice, to take cognizance of the case in review. It is confidently expected, however, that the hearing in review will be but a preliminary to further hearings as no matter which way the decision of the second tribunal may turn, application will be entered to have the case brought to the attention of a higher court.
