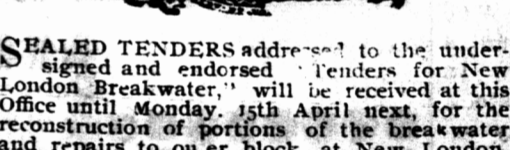

TEMPRANCE MEASURE.

BERLIN, March 30.—A bill has been introduced in the Prussian diet, presumably at the suggestion of Emperor William, directed against the misuse of alcohol. Count Douglas, an intimate friend of the kaiser, is the author of the measure, which is very stringent. It forbids the sale of alcoholic preparations containing fusel oil, prohibiting also the sale of intoxicating beverages to persons under 16 years of age, to persons known to be habitual drunkards, and to persons already under the influence of liquor. No intoxicating beverages are to be sold before 7 o'clock in the morning. In depots and public offices charts must be displayed showing the injurious effects of alcohol.

SHOT BY A WATCHMAN.

CHICAGO, March 30.—After having been wounded in a previous attempt at burglary a few hours before Cornelius Doherty one of four who attempted to break into the Newberry building on East Ontario street, met a tragic death last night while running away from Watchman Frank Kelly who shot him in the left temple and the thigh. Kelly had driven away three men earlier in the evening discovering them as they were climbing the fire escape.
